Background:

The Reconciliation and Federalism Support Project (REFS) is designed to support the Federal Government of Somalia (FGS) and the Federal Member States (FMS) to implement their chosen method of State Administration and Federalism process through need-based political settlement, boundary delimitation and multipronged reconciliation processes. The project is aimed to consolidate State-formation efforts towards building and harmonizing the emerging federal system in the FGS and the FMSs, ensuring alignment with the objectives of the NDP – 9, CDP 2021-25, UNSDCF and UNDP Strategic Plan (2018-21). More importantly, the Project is aimed to support the different levels of government to establish requisite administrative machinery geared towards the improved service delivery to the Somali people.

In order to achieve above-mentioned objectives, the REFS is engaging and facilitating the relevant line ministries and departments of both Federal and Federal Member State governments, civil society and think thanks in developing and operationalizing appropriate programmatic interventions, institutional and regulatory mechanisms, technical tools, and executive instruments to effectively translate the political/policy decisions/directions on federalism and reconciliation into demonstrable and functional governance framework(s). The specific areas where the project will provide technical assistance, financial, human resources and logistical support will be provided are set out in three outputs:

Output 1: Reconciliation mechanisms established in support of Administrative Arrangements in the Federal context (regional outreach and inclusiveness, boundaries)

Output 2: Federalism is Organized, Consistent and Coherent in all Federal Member States (organization, roles, responsibilities, powers) with the FGS

Output 3: Federal administration is enabled to improve effectiveness and efficiency (operational support, small scale works to support infrastructure, transport, essential equipment).

Grounds for No-Cost Extension (January - June 2022)

In view of COVID 19, political impasse on electoral model, and stalled negotiations between FGS and FMSes on allocation of power, the REFS project implementation framework was revised responding to the transient dynamics of reconciliation and federalisation in Somalia. Additionally, the funding gap faced by the project necessitated programmatic reprioritisation with some mandatory activities undertaken during the no-cost-extension period (1 April to 31st December 2021). However, the funding gap was bridged as late as in November 2021 with the disbursement of funds from Switzerland, leaving little window of time for planning and implementation of corresponding project activities until 31st December.

In the current context of ongoing (s)election process, the REFS counterparts have largely been pre-occupied with election related issues, and the implementation of project activities was impacted by the political expediencies which compelled UNDP to realign some of the activities contributing to unlock the political stalemate between FGS and FMS stakeholders.

Currently, the Project is in the process of consultations with FGS and FMS counterparts with two core objectives: (a) self-assessment by the counterparts on achievements, challenges, and lessons learned during the REFS project (2019-2021); and (b) participatory planning for the future program development (2022-2025). The outcomes of the consultations would be integrated into the program development, reflecting the context-specific insights, perspectives and needs informing the results framework of the new generation of REFS joint program.

Meanwhile, the donors' group supporting Inclusive Politics Pillar is also in the process of conducting consultations to develop 'theory of change' in view of emerging situations in Somalia. The findings of these consultations would be important to inform the programmatic priorities for REFS II. This would require continuity of REFS-I until June 2022 to have better clarity on post-election scenario for the REFS-II to be more responsive to the emerging situations and allowing the new project to be incongruent with the broader ToC agreed by the Inclusive Politics Pillar.

Hence, UNDP requested a no cost extension of REFS until 30 June 2022 to ensure continuity of strategic activities and consolidation of results leading to the next generation of REFS contributing to reconciliation and federalisation as critical components of state building in Somalia. The necessary discussions with donors, counterparts and partners have been completed, it is requested that UNDP approves the REFS extension till 30 June 2022 to ensure continuation of the support to political and social reconciliation.

Currently, the Project has aggregated \$ 1,518,294 available against which key strategic activities and results for six months (January-June 2022) have been planned in the Results Framework (Annex 1).
