LNP PSU provided with necessary equipment and transport to assist with prison perimeter security; and strengthen capacity for primary PSU duties.	LNP PSU will be provided with equipment and transport (for more details on delivery dates, please see tables above).	Initially, the delivery dates for equipment and transport were planned to be in December. The implementing partners agreed to delay the deliveries, taking into account that most manufacturers shut down between 15 December 09-15 Jan 2010 and that goods could have been "misplaced" at the airport in Liberia during the holiday season.

The construction activities started in November 2009 during the dry season and will be completed by end of March 2010. Facilities at the newly constructed Sanniquellic Central Prison include a 72-bed main prison building (about 5640 square feet); 2 exercise areas (1920 square feet each); a kitchen/store (687 square feet); generator house (253 square feet); security booth (117 square feet); 2 security watch towers (64 square feet each); 1 water well with a hand pump and a concrete block wall fence enclosed (within an area of 52668 square feet). The concrete floor of the main prison building is being east; the blocks wall for the kitchen/store has reached roof level and excavation of the foundation trenches for the concrete block wall fence is in progress.	The DSRSG, a host of Government of Liberia ministers and senior staff of UN agencies visited the site on 6th January 2010 to inspect ongoing construction activities. They were met on arrival by UNOPS Technical Team who briefed them with activities at site.

Qualitative achievements against expected results:

- 50 corrections officers being trained.
- All security transport, equipment and apparatuses have been or are being procured.
- The 72-bed prison facility has been laid out and is constructed as planned. The works will be completed by March 2009 with a six month liability period.


Challenges [If Necessary]:

- The limited initial timeframe for procurement of security and transport equipment. Initially planned to be delivered by November and December 209, the equipment will be delivered by January and February 2010. Indeed, many discussions were hold between the partners to have the appropriate specifications. This was fruitful and necessary but has implied some delays. Furthermore, the implementing partners have agreed to delay the deliveries, taking into account that most manufacturers were close between 15 December 09 15 Jan 2010 and goods could have been misplaced during the holiday season.
 - The limited initial timeframe to apply full standards procurement procedures for the construction activities.
 - The weather has not allowed starting the construction works before the dry season.


