		develop new national level waste management laws, policies and programmes. The second			
		component will comprise the development of an integrated solid waste management master			
	plan for Basrah governorate, rehabilitation/ upgrading the existing landfill site, establishment				
	of demonstration project, procurement of sanitation vehicles/ landfill equipment and capacity				
	building of gove	rnorate staff.			

Development Goal and Immediate Objectives

The goal of the project is to contribute to improved public health and environmental conditions in Iraqi cities by assisting the Ministry of Municipalities and Public Works and the Governorate of Basra with the development and implementation of new waste management laws, policies and programmes

The key immediate objectives:

- 1. to support national level initiatives by the Ministry of Municipalities and Public Works aimed at developing new laws, regulations, policies and programmes for the management of solid waste and for the decentralization of the delivery of waste management services to the municipal government level
- 2. to contribute to an effective waste management system in the Basra area

	Training 1 and 4 have a complementary part which is field visits to dumpsite in Egypt. This part is still pending because of Visa approval. *Note: according to the above the progress percentage reflects less value.		
Output 2.3 UNICEF	All machinery identified in the plan and approved in the subsequent meeting with counterpart has been committed and purchase orders were issued in late 2009. Truck loader and Weighbridge have already arrived to Basrah Landfill site; other machinery will be delivered shortly. Due to price difference between the planned and actual figures for machinery under output 2.3, a substantial surplus amount was experienced under this output. Another surplus amount coming from landfill construction (output 2.5) was also experienced for the same reason above. It has been decided re – programme this amount for procurement of machinery. During informal discussions with Basrah Municipality, the authority has shown interest in procuring more refuse trailers and compactor. Considering the prices of the refuse trailer and compactor, it will be possible to use this amount to procure additional 2 trailers and one compactor only, Basrah Municipality will send official letter confirming this requirement.	% of planned	70%

Output 2.5 UNICEF	In view of the magnitude of the works planned under the Landfill upgrade, the works have been sub-divided into smaller work packages – a) Survey & Soil Investigation; b) Admin Building, for the Landfill site and c) Landfill site works and access road. Survey and Soil investigation works was completed. Admin Building Weighbridge and Fence is still ongoing expected to complete physical work by mid May 2010. The Landfill site works and access road was awarded to a local company in Basrah and is expected to commence the work in April 2010.	% of planned	60%

Qualitative achievements against objectives and results

As part of the overall objective of the project, the Draft Iraq Waste Management Law and Final Master Plan for the Integrated Solid Waste Management (SWM) in Basrah have been completed. In addition a number of detailed documents – Capacity Development & Institutional Strengthening Plan; Equipment Procurement lan and Disposal Site Upgrading Plan have been completed. The above documents will form the basis for prioritising training of municipal staff, procurement of vital supplies/ equipment and the upgrading of landfill site.

In an effort to support national efforts to develop laws, regulations and policies, work has been completed in relation to the finalization of recommendations for short term priority actions to implement the master plan, and for changes to existing waste management laws, regulations and policies.

Aiming at strengthening the capacities of MMPW officials, study tours and training courses have been conducted during the reporting period on Integrated Waste Management and Hazardous Waste Management.

As of end March 2010, following are the key achievements: Basrah component

- The final version of the master plan in Arabic has been shared with the government for review and comments. The government has accepted the document and confirmed that all of their comments have been considered. Still pending final approval by the new government.
- Physical completion of the construction of administration building and fence will be expected in Mid May 2010.
- The Landfill site works and access road was awarded to a local company in Basrah and is expected to commence the work in April 2010.
- All machinery identified in the plan and approved in the subsequent meeting with counterpart has been
 committed and purchase orders were issued in late 2009. Truck loader and Weighbridge have already
 arrived to Basrah Landfill site; other machinery will be delivered shortly.
- Surplus amount due to reduced prices in items under output 2.3 and 2.5 will be used for machinery (output 2.3). Informal discussions with Basrah Municipality show their interest in procuring more refuse trailers and compactor. Basrah Municipality will send official letter confirming this requirement.
- As part of Hygiene Awareness plan for the Basrah landfill project, workshop will be organized in Erbil in the 4th week of April 2010 involving 30 participants representing stakeholders and community in Basrah governorate. The output of this workshop is to identify the key hygiene messages mainly related to best disposal practices.

Consulting report recommending the short term priority actions required to implement the national waste management master plan was completed. A second report recommending changes to existing waste management laws, regulations and policies has been completed.

Detailed designs for the improvements to two public works garages in Basrah have been completed and have been put out to tender.

Main implementation constrains & challenges (2-3 sentences)

It remains a challenge to get high level discussion of the proposed Draft Waste Management legislation and nomination of appropriate officials for this purpose. In packaging and contracting out works associated with the vehicle workshops in Basra progress has been constrained by the quality of local contractors.

Regarding implementation of the Basrah component

- Delayed provision of data and un-duly long time taken by the government to nominate participants to training programs affected timely submission of deliverables.
- Issuing Visas for Iraqi official faced a considerable delays and rejections.
- Belated decision on the location of site for the landfill upgrade has affected timely submission of the Disposal Site upgrade plan and consequently delayed its implementation.

Overall delays during this period were due to the preparations for the elections and the deteriorating security situation all over the country.
