All methodologies possible in monitoring the project will be applied. The monitoring will be carried out on monthly basis by the senior staff of Access-Aid. The project will measured against the set objectives, indicated targets and indicators formulated in the log frame of the project document. The methodologies will include site visits, observations and interviews with the beneficiaries. The project will also ensure that the beneficiaries are listed and every beneficiary signs his/her name upon accepting/receiving all the planned inputs including payment sheets for CFW and Cash Grant beneficiaries. The project will ensure beneficiaries receive message of the project through local FMs. The indicators evaluated include: the # of beneficiaries supported through CFW, # of water catchments rehabilitated, length of bushy roads rehabilitated and the number of beneficiaries supported through the cash grants.
