The program will link supplementary and therapeutic feeding to more development oriented activities i.e food demonstration minimum package of care and community involvement, during screening days health and nutrition workers will

CISP will monitor the project through direct presence and remote management methodology developed taking into consideration the specific security constraints of this area of Somalia and making the most of its prolonged and consolidated presence in the area. In particular:

- National staff based in the field will be responsible of direct implementation of the activities and to provide weekly flash reports of the activities to the international staff. On a monthly base a more detailed report will be provided including an update of baseline data, information on the evolution of potential beneficiary numbers (in particular IDPs), photo documentation, GIS data, financial and admin data following CISP management system rules, etc.
- The field manager through regular field visits (in principle on a monthly base) will supervise field implementation of the activities the collection of baseline data and their regular update by the national staff. The schedule of the visits will be constantly updated on the base of the evolution of the security situation.
- A constant flow of information about the intervention to and from the local community and an exchange of information and data from other humanitarian organisations and agencies operating in the area will be part of the monitoring and evaluation system
 International staff will be responsible of the management of the intervention following contractual arrangements and CISP
