3. BACKGROUND AND NEED	S ANAL	YSIS (plea	se adjust	row size as	needed)						
(A) Describe the project rationale based on identified issues, describe the humanitarian situation in the area, and list groups consulted.*	The project target areas (Bu'ale, Sakow and Salagle districts) of Middle Jubba region are among the most affected by the prevailing drought in Somalia. These communities have been affected by multiple shocks such as floods, drought and recurrent conflicts that threaten their lives and livelihoods. They are now facing severe humanitarian emergency and acute food and livelihood crisis. Failed deyr rains in most of the districts resulted in severe shortage of water and pasture in the grazing land, hence, reduced the agricultural productivity both in the riverine and agropastoral areas and for sorghum production in rain-fed zones. Crop failure in the rain-fed agricultural areas and the pastoral migration due to lack of water and pasture as well as the fighting in Mogadishu and some other part of the country increased the number of IDPs in these districts. Lack of pasture and water in the traditional grazing land and agropastoral areas in the region as well as the neighbouring regions (Gedo and Bay) resulted in massive animal movements through these districts towards Jilib and down to Jamame district of Middle and Lower Jubba regions respectively. UNICEF are planning to rehabilitate the non-functional one, both of the boreholes are of no use to the pastoral and agropastoral population and their animals due to the distance and the location of the boreholes (which is the town centres) because non of them is in the traditional grazing land or in the agropastoral area. During the water provision exercise, the functional borehole in Bu'ale will be used by the water vendor. Moreover, under normal conditions, the pastoral and the agro-pastoral population in the region mostly depend on rain water and hand-dug communal water catchments, but due to the affect of current drought as a consequence of the poor rainfall for the last raining season, all the water dams have dried up. Thus, lack of pasture in grazing land and the dried up water pans (dams) in the hinderland and in the agropastoral settlements resulted livestock outmigration, whereby, some of the JCC in partnership with UNDP, the HRF, UNICEF and FAO have implemented several interventions, such as rehabilitation of communal infrustructure (e.g. water pans, market shades, shallow-wells), rehabilitation of feeder roads, these projects have aided										
the local residents and they appreciated the positive impact beyond after it was completed. However, due to large number of displacements people fleeing from conflicts and conflicts of destitute families had put up makeshifts shelters and are living in squalor conditions in main towns and to secure work and sought refuge. There's dire need of urgent assistance to meet the needs of these people. The hardest hit group remains women and children, the malnutrition cases, mortality rates of children under five is all time high and lack of effective social amenities in the region has devastated the situation. Therefore, JCC has previously approached many donor agencies to support numerous programmes (including nitrition program with UNICEF) but is yet to secure a funding. 4. JCC intends to implement the project considering the feasibility and need analysis report conducted. Targeting and prioritising the affected households, including women-headed households and vulnerable beneficiaries. Therefore, the project will start with the following activities: 1. Conduct an all inclusive mobilization exercise on project objectives, scope and activities in all targeted areas.

2. Registration of the voucher for water beneficiaries. 3. Identify potential water vendor and with the help of project committees settling the water price per litre. 4. Organize meeting with the community selected project committees, water suppliers and possibly a representative from the money vendor. Followed by 5. Conduct a session with project community committees, the water suppliers and the money vendor for everyone to understand the implementation process of the voucher system. 6. Issuing serialized vouchers to the beneficiaries. 7. Provision of water and putting the vouchers collected from the beneficiaries by the water vendor and taking them to money vendor for payment. The organization will identify and consult the village elders, women and youth together define the selection criteria for the beneficiaries. JCC has strong presence in the areas and implemented several emergency and livelihoods support projects in these areas in the past. Considering the situation in each village, JCC will deploy staff to all the project sites to monitor the project activities using the beneficiaries list and attendance sheet to ensure workers turn up for work and activities is done as reguired. The staff with project committees will make daily visits to oversee the progress made at each interval, in both the water provision and the rehabilitation activities. The project manager will take 4-6 ad hoc visits and spot checks to ensure the smooth implementation of the activities. The JCC field staff will provide weekly reports (both narative and financial) and submit to their respective field office at district level and ensure all weekly payments are done. JCC, then, compiles the weekly reports submitted by the field staff to develop the project midterm report. To keep track of the project progress JCC staff will also document the project works in progress through photographs when the situation is favorable. JCC will monitor and evaluate the number of beneficiaries employed and paid as well as the amount of water supplied and verify by refereing to the weekly list of payment and vouchers to ensure transparency and accountability. The organization will provide timely reports as agreed with the project sponsor. JCC will also submit mid-term and final reports (both narrative and financial) and share the information of the project sponsor, by will ensure onwership, value for money and guide and lead the process
