At the inception of this project DRC will develop a monitoring and evaluation plan (MEP) with specific benchmarks that can track our progress against program indicators. The security situation in Somaliland allows for vigorous monitoring and impact assessments; DRC will take advantage of this situation and ensure program locations have staff that oversee implementation processes. Monthly technical monitoring visits will be carried out by senior staff to ensure quality programming. DRC will also endeavor to ensure quarterly joint monitoring visits are carried out involving members of relevant line ministries, district and community level officials in Puntland and Somaliland. In Puntland while there might be some areas that pose security restrictions, DRC will utilize the staff relationship with communities to ensure dedicated staff members are deployed in lose proximity to project locations in a bid to ensure constant monitoring of activities. DRC will track progress through weekly program updates and monthly or quarterly reports, these reports will be accompanied by photographs and statistical data from the field. The findings from the quarterly reports will drive DRC strategies, they will determine as to whether we change our program approach or not.
