The Medical officer - Primary Health Care of WHO will supervise the project, in collaboration with partners and technical support from key local staff, and monitor the progress against the objectives. Once medical supplies are received in each individual health facility, a delivery note will be signed off by the Director of the hospital (or acting person). This delivery note will be used by WHO for monitoring purposes. Reporting tools include reports (Commodity stocks, distribution lists, consumption and stock-out reports and warehouse logs). Implemented activities will be checked monthly against the detailed implementation plan to ensure that activities are implemented as planned.
