Improve the livelihood of approximately 1,400 extremely poor people living in Anbar Governorate by increasing their productive capacities in sustainable and profitable income generating activities through training, introducing efficient processing methods and provision of equipment

- 1. Provide targeted communities with the capacity to plan and manage their development activities and restoring a functional base for economic growth and social peace.
- 2. Improve the livelihood of approximately 1,400 people living in the project area through strengthening of their productive capacities in post-harvest and other incomegenerating activities, through training in vocational training centres (VTCs) which will be rehabilitated and equipped.
- 3. Enable large number of youth and women who have been deprived by the conflict to gain basic knowledge in productive skills through practical experiences and activity-based learning and provision of tools to start their own business.

Rehabilitation of Food and Non-Food Production Groups is completed and all equipment has been procured, installed and tool kits have been distributed to the beneficiaries.

Follow up of the production group sustainability was conducted for 3 months by business management ToT from agriculture directorate; the reports indicate that all Production Groups are working according to the plan.

All food and non-food components of the project are completed for FAO and UNIDO.
