CAPSCA Asia-Pacific Meetings	A total of ST participants attended the meeting, representing both Civil Aviation Administrations and Public Health Authorities, from 9 States/Administrations of the AP Region, i.e. Brunei Darussalam, Hong Kong China, Macao China, Malaysia, Mongolia, New Zealand, Philippines, Singapore, and Thailand. In addition to ICAO, partner organisations at the meeting included representatives from WHO, WFP, ACI, ASEF, ECAC, IATA, Cathay Pacific Airways, Malaysia Airlines, Malaysia Airports and Thai International Airways. The meeting included a training session for 'CAPSCA Assistance Visit' Technical Advisors, which was followed by a demonstration of a 'CAPSCA Airport Assistance Visit' to the Ulaanbaatar International Airport on 21st April 2012.
