Most of the activities planned in the project have been realized. While these activities have now been completed, fund utilization remains low as a payment for US\$ 93,000 has not yet been finalized.

Nutrition Cluster: No Cost Extension + Relocation of Training to Somaliland and Puntland

- The No-Cost Extension has been necessifiated by the unavailability of accommodation in Mogadishu which is required to conduct the monitoring visits and training facilitation by Nairobi-based teams as per the original proposal. However a number of planned activities have been completed as follows:

 The Nutrition Cluster for Banadir, Lower Shabelle and Middle Shabelle has met on a monthly basis through the leadership and coordination of the Nutrition Cluster Focal Point. This has seen an improvement in the coordination of Cluster activities in the region and improved information sharing.
- The Nutrition Cluster has conducted a five day intensive Nutrition in Emergencies (NIE) Training benefiting 36 Nutrition Cluster Banadir and shabelles partners including government, OIC and observers (full report annexed)





- The Nutrition Cluster conducted a five day Nutrition Cluster Awareness training for 40 partners in Banadir and the Shabelle regions including government officials
- The Nutrition Cluster Focal Point has conducted monitoring visits to all Banadir nutrition services and provided feedback to partners on improvements needed.
