Mercy Corps project was selected by the Education Cluster for the second round of the 2012 Allocation early October 2012

The PPA was signed by UNDP on 21 November 2012 and by Mercy Corps on 22 November 2012. Mercy Corps received the first installment on 10 December 2012.

Due to the contracting delay, implementation only started late into the second month of the project. Due to the fixed date of the contract, Mercy Corps eventually had a little more than 5 months to implement this 7 months proposal.

During those 5 months, Mercy Corps managed to achieve 100% of our target of building 50 Temporary Learning Spaces. However, due to the unavailability of supplies provided in-kind from the UNICEF pipeline, Mercy Corps has not been able to achieve our target of 100 latrines, and only built 22. Due to minimal spending during the first two months of implementation, Mercy Corps has only spent 66% of the budget.

Mercy Corps therefore proposes a 3-months No Cost Extension in order to achieve the target of 100 latrines built and ensure the expected sanitation outcome, a critical humanitarian need. Mercy Corps is confident we can achieve this target without the need to realign cost categories in the budget. The budget is currently well balanced, and as no support costs were charged during the first two months of implementation, continued and adequate level of support will be allocated to the project to ensure quality implementation.

The Education Cluster endorses this request, recognizing the challenges encountered by the agency in implementing the activities as planned.

The Education Cluster confirms that the mentioned implementing partner is a crucial actor in providing a response to the huge and ongoing need existing in their project areas.

Regarding delay of UNICEF pipeline, this does not relate to education supplies but WASH supplies. UNICEF Education only manages education emergency supplies such as school in a box, recreational kits, school tents, blackboard, ECD kit and tarpaulin. UNICEF Education, not being the core pipeline manager for these kinds of supplies, was not able to secure them from the WASH pipeline despite efforts made to facilitate with UNICEF WASH. Based on this lesson learnt, Education Cluster is working with WASH Team to improve cross supply mechanism for upcoming round of CHF.

Education cluster consulted and agreed with Mercy Corps on the need for 4 months NCE up to 30 August 2013 in order to complete project activities of constructing emergency learning spaces and distribution of Education in Emergency supplies. OCHA requested Education cluster to explain why the pipeline items were not provided to Mercy Corps. The cluster provided the required explanation in their review remarks as above.
