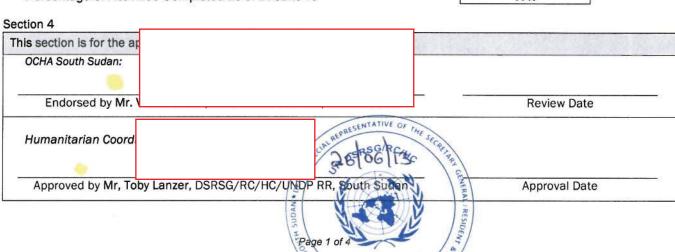

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Section 5 - Revision Description and Justification

UNESCO Juba requests for the project duration to be extended to the 31 September 2013. The reasons are as follows:

- 1) The CHF disbursement was delayed until 12 November 2012. The consultant we had identified for the position was expecting to begin work on 1 October 2012, as this was our envisaged project start-date. The consultant was unavailable to work during the month of December and the revision of the draft materials was therefore postponed and did not commence until January, causing a delay in the start and therefore the completion of the project.
- 2) This project includes three main components for funding: (1) staffing for material development, (2) printing of materials; (3) training. Within the CHF 2012 budget submitted, UNESCO did not allocate funds for printing of materials because, at the time of submission, a funding source had been identified for the printing. However, there were changes to the donor priorities and this funding was not made available. Without funds to print the materials, UNESCO is unable to deliver the training component of this project on time. In order to rectify this, UNESCO's submission to the first round of CHF 2013 includes funding for printing. This has been approved and UNESCO will be able produce the materials and roll-out the training within the CHF 2013 project timeframe. In order to ensure that we can complete all printing of materials and then align the training components of the two projects, we request an extension until 31 September 2013.
- 3) Activities completed so far include the revision of draft teaching and learning materials and the development of new materials, as laid out in the project work plan. Activities still to be accomplished are the endorsement of all materials by line Ministries and partners and then printing, training and roll-out. Once this project phase is completed on 31 September 2013, UNESCO will not need another NCE.

Explain the rational to endorse or reject the request

Due to the CHF delayed disbursement and the lack of funds for printing, the Education Cluster endorses this request for a no cost extension. This extension will enable UNESCO to print all materials and deliver all trainings planned under the CHF 2012 round 1 and CHF 2013 round 1 projects in a timely and thorough way.
