DRC will conduct post-distribution monitoring to ensure the appropriateness of shelters constructed, effectiveness of distribution methodology and to be aware of any protection risks encountered. DRC's monitoring and evaluation plan (MEP) will enable identification and addressing of project weaknesses in a timely manner and enhancement of project strengths. The MEP will define standards and benchmarks to measure outcomes and quality of the project at completion. Indexing, general protection assessments, focus group discussions and key informant interviews will provide baseline information on the beneficiaries at household level. Data will be disaggregated by gender, age and diversity. Compliance with the Humatian Accountability Partnership benchmarks will be ensured during the project duration. Where access allows, senior technical staff (coordinators, advisors and infrastructure engineers) will visit the sites frequently to ensure quality control and provide additional oversight. DRC staff will generate monthly monitoring reports and quarterly progress reports. DRC will share progress with the Cluster and feed into monthly Cluster reporting mechanisms such as the 4Ws. Photos from during and after construction will be provided to the CHF secretariat, and GPS coordinates of all shelters uploaded and attached to the final CHF report. Beneficiary lists and contacts will be provided. Interim and final reports will be provided to the CHF Secretariat.

OCHA's situational analysis for Hiraan indicates that by October 2012, only 25,950 (51%) of the 50,749 targeted for the end year had received NFI kits. Shelter continues to be a major need in the region. DRC will carry out extensive consultations with the beneficiary community in Beletweyne to establish the nature and duration of access to land among protracted IDPs and urban poor before interventions take place. DRC will advocate with the community and local authorities to guarantee access to land for three to five years in order to facilitate the constructions of CGI lite shelters.
