#### **ACTIVITIES REPORTED:**

- The programme has directly assisted around 1,400 small scale farmers and around 300 rural women directly. Participants received training in production, post harvest, value addition and packing and packaging and compliance with international standards, increasing productivity, reducing costs and improving income as well as access to markets. Introduction and promotion of value adding industries such as packing and packaging, sundrying of tomatoes and pomegranate arils.
- Linkages of farmers with input suppliers, assuring the availability and use of quality products as well as food processors, creating marketing channels.
- Infrastructural upgrade of 3 postharvest centers for compliance with quality and food safety requirements. Promotion of group farming, 45 farmers collectively producing okra and 17 collectively producing grapes as well as capacity building for group certification of farmers for good agricultural practices, for improved market access.
- Two shareholding agribusiness companies established by farmers after completion of business plan. 41 women starting their own small businesses after capacity building on entrepreneurship and life skills. Study on financial and non financial services in Upper Egypt
- Desk review of cooperatives law, Framework for the inclusion of women in the horticultural value chains, gender and Trade Action Guide and fact sheet Women in agriculture produced.
- Documentation of experiences in the form of films, reports, success stories, newsletters. Public appearances though website, facebook, linkedin and radio and TV broadcasts.

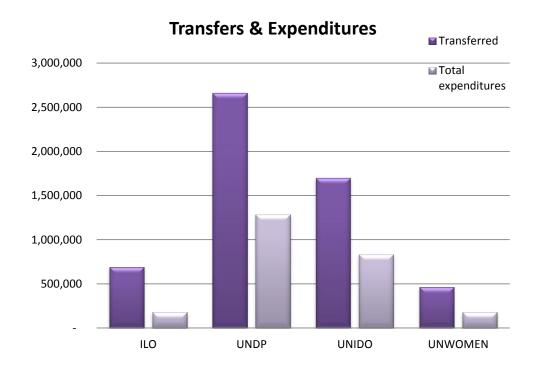
