PBF Outcome Area <sup>5</sup>	The Program is providing support to crucial justice system institutions to bring down impunity rates, strengthen the rule of law and the provision of justice. Main objective: To strengthen national (state) capacities for the analysis and investigations of crime. The Program responds to PBF Priority Area 1: Support to the implementation of Peace Agreements and political dialogue particularly in relation to the strengthening of national institutions and processes set up under those agreements; and within it, specifically to PBF Outcome 2: Judiciary system is strengthened through equipping, staffing and training of the Office of the Magistrate and courts to establish

Strategic Result (PMP): 1 Security sector reforms and judiciary systems put in place and providing services and goods at national and local level that reinforce the Rule of Law (RoL).</li> <li>Immediate Objectives:</li> <li>Strengthened capacities of the Prosecutor General's Office's Department of Criminal Investigations for the processing of crime scenes, monitoring and surveillance of criminal activities.</li> <li>Strengthened capacities of the Prosecutor General's Office for knowledge management and intelligence of criminal phenomena through the expansion and strengthening of its Analysis Unit.</li> <li>Strengthened capacities of the Prosecutor General's Office for strategic penal prosecution of femicide, trafficking in persons, and violence against women and children within the specialized prosecution units.</li> <li>Strengthening of the National Civilian Police's Department for the investigation of sexual crimes, trafficking in persons, and crimes against children and adolescents through the implementation of a new management model for criminal investigation.</li> <li>Enhanced inter-institutional coordination and external cooperation to strengthen criminal investigation capacities and penal prosecution among the Prosecutor General's Office, the Ministry of the Interior and the National Institute of Example.</li> </ul>
Qualitative assessment of achievements and challenges	<ul> <li>Forensic Sciences.</li> <li>The main achievements include: <ul> <li>The project has contributed to the strengthening of the state capacities in criminal investigations, specifically, in the criminal prosecution of felonies against women and children, particularly sexual violence and femicide, since the Office of the Prosecutor's General (<i>Ministerio Pibblico</i>) carried out important changes in the protocol of procedures in the crime scene, in areas such as forensic photography, video filming of traces, handling of corps for their remission to the corresponding morgues, and concrete petitions of specific analysis.</li> <li>Training processes have been carried out in the capital city as well as in the interior of the Republic. The content of this training comprised criminal investigation and it was carried out in inter-institutional coordination between the Office of the Prosecutor's General and the National Institute of Forensic Sciences (INACIF – for its name in Spanish). This training had an approximate coverage of 85% of the personnel in charge of the criminal investigations at the end of June, 2013.</li> <li>The support given by the project through the hiring of 10 analysts for the extension of the capacities of the Office of the Prosecutor has been key for knowledge and intelligence handling of the criminal phenomenon, particularly, through the expansion and strengthening of the Criminal Analysis Unit. This support has allowed the improvement of the effectiveness in different Prosecutor's Offices (Women Affairs; Trafficking in persons; Organized Crime; Metropolitan; Mixco; Villa Nueva; Escuintla; Huehuetenango; Quetzaltenango; and Chimaltenango), since a significant increase in the efficacy of the prosecutor's General, ensuring sustainability.</li> <li>The creation of the Forensic Informatics Unit has been achieved. Also, one of the project 's achievements is that the hired staff is being absorbed by the Office of the Prosecutor's General, ensuring sustainability.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

- The creation of the Financing Investigation Unit was supported, with the participation of the CICIG.
- A data base for femicide has been established, systemizing the cases of
violent deaths of women; this database is fed with the updated data from
INACIF and from the Prosecutors.
<ul> <li>The Ministry of the Interior has progressed in the construction of a model for</li> </ul>
the trafficking in persons section of the Specialized Division of Criminal
Investigations was designed and implemented replicating the model in the
Homicide Section. A change in the work environment, as well as the new
tools that have been provided, had a direct impact in the conduct of the
officers of the new Specialized Unit. In addition to specialized training on
legal procedures regarding the trafficking in persons, victimology and victim
first aids, gender focused issues and special investigation procedures have
been designed and have already started.

institutional reform and the compliance of its strategic plan 2011-2014 is the construction and institutionalization of the Curriculum on Studies for
Criminal Investigations Directorate (DICRI) and of the curricular structure of the Prosecutors Career.
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Main challenges:
- Inter-agency coordination is always a challenge, but key consensus and a
fluid communication have been achieved. Also, each agency has its own
processes and timing, and this is visible in the execution levels.
- There is no culture of strategic planning in the Office of the Prosecutor's
General at mid and long term; this fact is an obstacle for the sustainable
processes.
