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



III. IMPLEMENTATION AND MONITORING ARRANGEMENTS

To support the UNDAP (2011-2015), the Government and the UNS in Uruguay agreed to establish the Uruguay One UN Coherence Fund; a common, un-earmarked, development fund, under the leadership of the Resident Coordinator. The Uruguay One UN Coherence Fund supports the coordinated resource mobilization, allocation and disbursement of donor-contributed resources for the unfunded elements of the One UN Programme.

The Uruguay One UN Coherence Fund has several governance mechanisms to ensure proper management of funds, supervision of project execution, and monitoring of results. The mechanisms are: The Coherence Fund Steering Committee, The Coherence Fund Consultative Committee, The Management Committees, and the Administrative Agent (AA).

The members of the Management Committee are: Presidency of the Republic, Office of Planning and Budget (OPP)², Ministry of Social Development (MIDES), Ministry of Labour and Social Security (MTSS), National Administration of Public Education (ANEP), the Ministry of Housing, Land Use and Environment (MVOTMA), the Public Health Services Administration (ASSE), and the National Institute for Employment and Professional Training (INEFOP); the executing UN Agencies (UN Women, UNDP, and UNICEF) and the associated UN Agencies (ILO, UNEP, UNESCO).

IV. RESULTS

This programme was developed under the implementation of the Delivering as One approach in Uruguay as pilot country.

It was developed as one of the objectives of the UNDAF 2007-2010 and the One UN Programme 2007-2010 "Building Capacities for Development" in Uruguay. Subsequently, it was made part of the UNDAF 2011-2015 and the Action Plan.

This project was developed as a top priority by the Government of President Jose Mujica after taking office in March 2010 to provide solutions in the housing and living standards of the most vulnerable populations. In this effort, the UNS provided support and guidance in the development of the short-term and long-term strategies. It also supported the establishment of pilot processes to provide solutions and social assistance to the vulnerable populations.

Partnerships and inter-Agency relationship. Impact on results:

The Management Committee gathered all relevant stakeholders in the joint project and was utilized as the space to share information and to reach consensus on issues related to the implementation of the agreed activities. Particularly, the Management Committee has served as the space to develop strategies to be implemented.

Throughout implementation, there was a very good level of collaboration among implementing UN Agencies (UN Women, UNDP, UNICEF); this facilitated planning activities and monitoring the implementation of the project. UN Agencies coordinated their efforts and often adjusted their implementation strategies according to the needs of the project as a whole.

Output 1: Steering Commission of the *Plan Juntos* strengthened through technical assistance. (UNDP)

- A short-term strategic plan was produced to guide the overall process, selection of households, selection of pilot zones, evaluation plan, cost estimates, process design, and communication systems.
- Support was provided to the Steering Commission of the *Plan Juntos* in planning, programming, evaluation, monitoring, law, technical operations, information and communication.
- Cross-ministry and inter-Agency dialogues were strengthened to provide expert technical support and advice in the development of the plan.

Output 2: Five-year Plan strengthened in its design and implementation. (UNDP, UNICEF)

- The development of the five-year plan included analyses on the strengths, the achievements of the current pilot programmes, the management and the expected results.
- A protocol was written on environmental planning and management for the proposed areas to build the housing settlements. Report is due in March 2012.
- A proposal was made to address water drainage issues in the proposed settlement areas in accordance with the Directorate of Waters recommendations.
- The five-year plan was developed including habitability and social policies. Nine points of actions were identified for the five-year plan including: the selection criteria for settlements, costs, process designs, evaluation plan, communication systems, etc.

Output 3: Two pilot experiences of the *Plan Juntos* (social and housing integration) in selected areas supported. (UNICEF, UN Women)

- Two phases were held to implement the social inclusion and participation by children living in the identified pilot areas with specific and tailored school programmes. School programs were designed for children to participate during the summer months transforming schools into community centers where infancy and social public policies could be implemented.
- During the normal school year, the programs were extended to include activities in: music, artistic expression, theatre, murga, and others.
- Workshops were also held for adults and families too: child care, nutritional good practices, and overall health.
- The implementation of social programmes was also strengthened to incorporate the participant families into nutritional efforts, financial assistance, health services and education. Community networks were also strengthened to provide adequate monitoring and support to participating families.
- Employability conditions and skills were enhanced for the participating families, particularly for women. Specifically, the labour insertion programme by INMUJERES was strengthened by incorporating modules that addressed the needs of the target population and the participating families.
