The Government Counterpart, the Ministry of Environment and Renewable Energy, endorsed the Sri Lanka UN-REDD National Programme officially, in December 2012. Upon approval and releasing of budgets, the project inception workshop was conducted from 4-7 June 2013, in two sessions. The first session was an internal workshop organized on 4 - 5 June 2013, during which the project implementing partners reviewed and agreed on the major components of the project such as results framework, monitoring framework, risk log and implementation arrangements.

The second session was the official launch of the Programme and validation workshop with national stakeholders, which was conducted on 7 June 2013.

2.1.2 Please provide a brief overall assessment of any measures taken to ensure the sustainability of the National Programme results during the reporting period. Please provide examples if relevant. (200 words)

The Inception Workshop contributed to participants' awareness and understanding of the concept of the UN-REDD Programme in general and REDD+ in particular. The participation of the members of the Indigenous Community at the launch added value to the event and this was highlighted as an important step in effective stakeholder engagement.

Stakeholder workshop was held to finalize the selection criteria of the NGO/CSO/CBO representation for the PEB of the project.
