Project Description: Each ECM will receive USD 1,000,000 for quick impact projects in each of the three affected countries. This will provide the ECMs with a degree of flexibility to respond quickly to urgent, high priority needs not funded through other mechanisms. The projects will support the implementation of the national plan within the operational framework of 4 lines of action and 5 enabling activities. All supported quick impact projects will be small-scale, relatively low cost, and implementable. ECMs will be responsible for prioritizing, selecting, managing and reporting on each of these projects. - a) Rationale for this project: This project will provide UNMEER ECMs with a flexible source of funding to rapidly deploy toward high priority needs. The role of the ECM is to coordinate the Ebola crisis response in each of the three most affected countries and move quickly to fill any identified gaps. Funding for quick impact project will support this key function of UNMEER ECMs.
- b) Coherence with existing projects: This project will aim to fill minor gaps in the overall Ebola response and support/underpin major projects across all strategic objectives.
- c) Capacity of RUNO(s) and implementing partners: UNMEER country offices are operating under the leadership of ASG level crisis managers and senior-level operational staff. UNMEER country office will coordinate the implementation of these projects in cooperation with partners including Government and state institutions, commercial companies and registered and non-registered NGOs, UN agencies and international agencies. The ECM will work to ensure that selected implementing partners have the capacity to deliver on the project. Additional oversight for monitoring and reporting will be provided by UNMEER headquarters in Ghana as required.
- d) Proposal management: Responsibility for prioritizing, selecting, managing and reporting on each of these projects will rest with the ECM. A project manager will be appointed by the ECM to operationalize each project. Detailed records of procurement and expenditure will be kept and reported to UNMEER headquarters at the initial decision to approve a project, within 72 hours of the final expenditure towards the project.
- e) Risk management: The need for rapid implementation may lead to unforeseen risks.

f) Monitoring & Evaluation: In addition to financial reporting, projects approved will be assessed on the basis of their contribution to the UNMEER's four lines of action: case finding and contact tracing; case management; community outreach and social mobilization; and ensuring safe and dignified burials. The project officer will briefly report outputs and impacts of the project against these lines of action. Project officer, in accordance with the frequency of reporting established by the Ebola MPTF Advisory Committee, will provide monthly reporting (1-2 pages) on grant utilization to the MPTF Secretariat.
