### Section 5 - Revision Description and Justification

### Description and justification of requested change

This request is made to revise the budget line for Personnel, which has exceeded the original budget by 107% or double the amount of the original allocation as indicated in the attached excel sheet. UNOPS had submitted proposals under consideration by OFDA and ECHO in 2013 and it was expected that once these projects were approved, they would co-fund the staff working under the Emergency Response Unit (ERU). The OFDA funding was awarded to UNOPS in 2013. However, before the project started, it has gone through several revisions as the situation on the ground was evolving constantly due to weather, security and price escalations, which rendered almost impossible to carry on the work. The project was eventually cancelled on the basis that there was insufficient time to meet the timeline that was given by the urgent nature of the work since a new review guideline for infrastructure works introduced at OFDA's HQ office would have required another month to process the amendment to the original agreement. Similarly, the proposal submitted to ECHO in 2013 for activities to be implemented in 2014 did not materialize because of the changed security landscape and priorities of ECHO after the violence erupted in South Sudan during December 2013. As the main objective of the ERU was to support the Logistics Cluster through providing a standby capacity to respond quickly to the emergent access needs of humanitarian agencies, in the absence of other projects to support the ERU, the budget allocation under the personnel costs in this project had to be increased disproportionately to maintain this capacity and undertake infrastructure assessment and works at a short notice albeit most of the projects could only be resumed in March 2014.

### List activities that were implemented during project period:

### **Emergency infrastructure assessment:**

- (1) Scope for establishment of three camp sites for refugees in Mingkaman, i.e. access roads, including those from each of the three sites to the main trunk road; and from the humanitarian hub to the main road
- (2) Assessment for the construction of a new helipad in Mingkaman;
- (3) Assessment of road from Juba to Mingkaman; and
- (4) Assessment for preparation of MSU platforms, Rumbek.

# Infrastructure works:

- (1) A new helipad in Mingkaman was constructed on schedule and within the estimated cost. The helipad is currently in use for air transportation of goods, services, and personnel in support of humanitarian activities.
- (2) Road from the main trunk road to murram borrow pit (3.5km) leading to helipad was cleared during the helipad construction works. Rehabilitation of the same road is ongoing, for which the cost was partly covered by CHF but mostly with funds from ECHO.
- (3) Construction of platforms and erection of 4 rub halls in Rumbek was completed.

# Review remarks by cluster coordinator. Name of reviewer:

Explain the rational to endorse or reject the request

Although the original plan for UNOPS was not to construct a helipad in Mingkaman, after violence erupted in Mid December 2013 Mingkaman quickly became a very large IDP site. Given the large number of beneficiaries in this one isolated location, there was an urgent need for emergency access into this area to enable the humanitarian community the ability to deliver their programmes. To facilitate the movement of passengers and life-saving cargo, UNOPS constructed the helipad which is now a regular UNHAS

The Logistics Cluster endorses this request from UNOPS.

# Review remarks by CHF Technical Secretariat: Name of reviewer Anne-Sophie Le Beux

CHF Technical Secretariat reviewed the request and asked UNOPS to update the expenditure information and provide justifications for the revisions in the budget. CHF Technical Secretariat has expressed concern to the fact that UNOPS did not follow the right procedure for requesting allocation revision that is carrying out the changes to the initially approved budget before and submitting a post facto request.

Logistics cluster reviewed and endorsed the request based on the current need for helipad in Mingkaman.
