## MCA [7] - Cash incentives for workers

Collaborating with governments in the affected countries, UNDP is ensuring thousands of health workers on the frontline are promptly paid their salaries and allowances, including back pay. Working with the respective government ministries, UNDP's teams are improving the accuracy of payroll lists and assisting in the harmonization of salaries and incentives.

UNDP is helping these countries overcome infrastructural challenges by assisting financial institutions, mobile operators, technology service providers and partners in developing payment systems. In Macenta, Guinea where banking facilities were not available UNDP successfully arranged cash payments to health workers. Focusing on strengthening structures that will expand access of affordable financial services, UNDP is also assisting in the development of strong information management systems and platforms.

A regional support team has been setup in Accra to provide support to UNMEER, UNDP, and national partners. The team consists of experts in regulatory and technical aspects of payment operations, providing regional and remote assistance to Country Teams. The team will continue providing the countries including national partners with much needed support in the coming month and supporting reporting to the UNMEER dashboard, especially on the diagnostics study that will be conducted in each country.
