Key Achievements (please use this section to highlight your key achievements for the month, using bullet points if preferred)

- UNDP QIPs team rolled out presentations and relevant documents on QIPS, in all Ebola hot spots, namely Port Loko, Kambia and Tonkolili and key members of the DERCs, NGOs and CBOs fully attended the sessions. The UNDP QIPs team is considering holding similar meetings in other districts of the Country and preparatory arrangements are underway.
- So far in late August, the UNDP QIPs team received 3 (three) proposals none of which have been approved by the Project Review Committee (PRC). Subsequently, partnering DERCs (Port Loko and Kambia) indicated that they received a total of 10(ten) proposals (8 and 2 respectively), which were submitted to UNDP in September 2015.
- The PRC conducted its maiden meeting with UNDP on 26th August 2015, under the new QIPs management arrangements and arrived at key action points relevant for implementation. The PRC agreed to meet on Tuesdays (weekly), in order to review and approve submitted proposals.

Delays or Deviations (if any, briefly describe the delays or changes in focus, approach or targets, and provide a short justification for the change (1-2 paragraphs)

• There have been delays in the process of obtaining proposals submitted through the DERCs, mainly due to the DERCs committee members not convening on time to pre-review, endorse and submit proposals to UNDP Country Office. The DERC committee members of Tonkolili, Port Loko and Kambia, have been also extremely under pressure, due to other compelling Ebola response activities, not permitting them to meet often. It is envisaged that this will however improve, as the UNDP QIPs team have engaged with committee members on ways of improving this delay.
