September 2015 marked the original end of the project. A no-cost extension was obtained for the period October – December 2015, which allows more time for implementation of project activities and finalization of the project.

UNDP

During this month, MRU participates in the Organization of The Regional Meeting (on Youth Empowerment and Demographic Dividend) of the Ministers of Youth of the 3 most affected countries by EVD (Liberia, Sierra Leone and Guinea) and provides substantial financial support to this regional meeting (meals and local transport fares). This Regional meeting is part of Post Ebola Recovery Plan's activities and aims to share lessons learnt and adopt one Strategy for the 3 countries in the response of youth concerns.

For MRU, this participation will contributed to reach the Result 6 "Lobbying and Political Support for Ebola Initiatives is Reinforced at National Level".

MRU has 14 Confidence Building Units (CBU) functioning. These CBU had established before the MPTF project few years ago. In the previous monthly reports, it was not mentioned. In order to correct this mistake, we decided to mention them in this current report. Through the MPTF project, MRU would support these CBU in order to reinforce their capacity and improve the functioning.



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UNICEF

This project was initially expected to run between February 2015 and August 2015. However, due to a request from the implementing partner, the Mano River Union, this project has now been extended until the end of this year.

Since the initial agreement was signed, the nature of the response has evolved and, as such, the supplies needed have also changed. UNICEF is therefore currently assessing the project's current supply needs during this third phase of the Ebola Response. A detailed description of the supplies to be procured by UNICEF will be provided shortly.

UNFPA

This monthly report highlights the activities performed during this last month of September 2015 as well as the major objective of the project which is to improve community knowledge, support the community engagement activities and health system resilience in the border areas affected by Ebola. It is in this context that UNFPA continues to support 34 health facilities located in the borders areas of Sierra Leone and Liberia by paying the salaries for 68 midwives and providing maternity commodities, kits and equipment.

- There were improvements in Reproductive Health indicators, such as use of skilled birth attendants and overall utilization of health facilities by women.
- > Decrease of maternal and infant morbidity and mortality in the health facilities targeted by the project.
- Availability of Reproductive health commodities in the targeted health facilities and reduction of stock out
- > Availability of midwives qualified in health facilities
