MRU provided support to the Ministry of International Cooperation in organizing two (2) regional meetings in Conakry:

- Meeting of MRU's countries' Ministries of Finance and Economy held in Conakry, 20-21 June 2015
- Summit of MRU's countries Heads of States held in Conakry, 28 June 2015

UNICEF

For months no Ebola cases has been notified in Nzerekore region, once the epicenter of the epidemic;



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UNICEF is working with the Mano River Union to sustain prevention efforts; UNICEF and MRU have installed and equipped 09 crossing points on the border with Liberia and Sierra Leone.

Mano River Union is working with women groups in Nzerekore region for sensitization campaigns; CWC members have integrated into village health committees to undertake community surveillance.

UNFPA

UNFPA continues to support the Ministry of Health in mitigating the impact of the Ebola outbreak on sexual reproductive health and rights and to prevent maternal deaths. UNFPA, with funding from MPTF, is supporting 25 Health facilities "Safe Maternal Clinics" with medical, non-medical equipment and by staffing them with 50 midwives and Technical platform.


In the context of increasing the number and access to operational health facilities that provide quality sexual Reproductive maternal, neonatal and adolescent health (SRMNAH) services including emergency obstetric and Neonatal care (EmONC) and Family Planning services in Ebola-affected communities; Mano River Midwifery Initiative supported Guinea Government in term of Human resources; the 50 midwives were recruited and deployed in 25 Health facilities 2 midwives per health facility.

We conducted a needs assessment in terms of Human resources, Equipment, reporting system and collection of data within 25 health facilities targeted by the initiative in framework of strengthening those health facilities.

In order to ensure the supply of essential life-saving drugs, equipment and family planning commodities in the selected Ebola-affected districts. Different kits, medicals and equipments were distributed in 17 health facilities. It remains 8 health facilities targeted by the Initiative and an increase in technical platform was provided for quality care

So therefore, 25 health facilities have been strengthened in their capacity to provide quality maternal health services and improving access.
