## MCA [ 11]

(Narrative)

Activities continued as scheduled during the second month of project implementation. As of end of February:

- 2 National Volunteers were recruited and supporting training activities of youth volunteers in Conakry.
- 400 young volunteers from Conakry and Kindia, have been trained in Ebola prevention techniques, and were conducting their activities mainly in the Conakry area, which is the most affected area of the Epidemic. Following the schedule, future trainings will be done in Mamou, Kankan, Nzerekore and Faranah.
- -150 police officers, who received training during the previous period, were conducting Ebola prevention and were following Ebola protocols, mainly protocols focused in controlling movements of Ebola patients.
- -5,000 persons, of whom around 3,000 were women, have been reached by social mobilization. These activities were held in the 116 Community Watch Committees (CWC). Training of M&E supervisors to ensure programmatic quality and follow up of CWC activities is organized for the incoming period.

Due to the evolution of the epidemic and the political situation of the country, it has been decided to reduce the number of National UNV to be hired. Decisions will be taken during the next month.
