#### A. Humanitarian Context Analysis

Overall living conditions in South Sudan have deteriorated greatly since the beginning of the crisis in December 2013. Prior to the crisis, access to adequate water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH) services had already been a chronic challenge in South Sudan. However, the ongoing insecurity which resulted in population displacement in large numbers has further exacerbated the situation. Over one million people have been internally displaced since the onset of the crisis, often seeking shelter in over-congested areas with limited access to services. The protracted nature of the displacement and the coming of the rainy season further increases the risk of waterborne diseases and other hazards associated with inadequate access to WASH services. Furthermore, the declaration of a cholera outbreak in Juba in May 2014 has necessitated WASH actors to quickly scale up efforts to mitigate the spread of this highly infectious disease.

#### **B. Grant Request Justification**

The humanitarian country team/WASH cluster has identified that timely and adequate provision of life-saving WASH services to the affected populations is one of the highest priority, and that there is a need to strengthen the humanitarian response capacity to do so. To this end, it is essential that appropriate WASH supplies in adequate quantities are procured and deployed to priority areas, which will enable WASH partners to respond to acute onset emergency situations in a timely manner and to rapidly scale up the response as necessary. The safety and wellbeing of thousands of internally displaced persons (IDPs), refugees and host communities depends on how rapidly humanitarian response can be provided and scaled up, especially in terms of the provision of safe water, adequate sanitation and promotion of hygiene, to mitigate preventable diseases and deaths associated with WASH conditions.

The WASH cluster has established and maintains the core pipeline of WASH emergency supplies in South Sudan since 2010, catering to an increasing need for better planning, response and coordination among a large number of WASH actors present in the country. The WASH core pipeline is a mechanism to allow for timely and efficient delivery of WASH relief items to populations in need through standardizing relief items, achieving economy of scale, and enables WASH actors' immediate access to essential and standard supplies in response to emergencies. The maintenance of the core pipeline system is in particular relevant during the rainy season when logistical challenges intensify. During the rainy season, 60% of roads become impassable and hence much of the transportation of relief items to remote areas, including Unity and Upper Nile states which are also severely affected by the ongoing insecurity, require air transportation, whereas many NGO partners do not have the capacity, in both resources and expertise, to mobilize air assets in a timely manner. IOM has been procuring and transporting WASH emergency supplies for the core pipeline since February 2014, with a responsibility to cater to 12,5% of the total cluster pipeline needs.

IOM proposes to fulfil this responsibility by maintaining and scaling up ongoing efforts to procure and manage WASH pipeline supplies within the cluster core pipeline system.
