AMURT International is seeking the approval for extension of the project duration for three months ending on 31 December 2013 to complete the remaining project activity. The project activity of trainings on vegetable production and post harvesting practices was hampered by heavy rains rendering some locations inaccessible. The delay in disbursement of funds one month after signing the PPA to some extend caused a delay in completion of the project.

AMURT International had projected to train 20 cereal production farmer groups, 15 groups' vegetable production farmers and 6 school gardens. The FSL team completed training 12 cereal farmer groups out of the planned 20 farmer groups; 3 school garden PTA members out of 6 school garden PTAs and plan to train 10 new groups of vegetable production.

Vegetable farmers were also not adequately provided with seeds and pesticides due to scarcity of the seeds in Aweil and also they could not plant sooner due to the heavy rains experienced in Northern Bahr El Ghazal. The vegetable farmers targeted for this activity live near the wetlands and are in a position to carry out the planting and harvesting of vegetables successfully. Training of pesticide application, harvesting and marketing is key to the success of this project and the FSL team look forward to the achievement end of November 2013. The seeds, tools and pesticides have since been procured and are awaiting distribution and training for the remaining 10 groups of 50 farmers per group

It was recommended prior to filing NCE, planned monitoring and evaluation by the FSL M&R officer to the project to assess project progress was necessary and this further delayed AMURT International filing for NCE.

The achievement of 83% of the project activities could not be achieved without the support of suppliers who after many years of cooperation with AMURT extend credit facilities
