Letters of Agreements (LOAs) were signed with the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry, Tourism, Animal Resources, Fisheries, Cooperatives and Rural Development (MAFTAFCRD), VSF S, VSF G, and VSF B. The main goal of the project is; i) Building resilience to the threat to cassava disease for increased food availability through distribution and production of clean cassava seed in Eastern Equatoria, Western Bhar el Ghazal and Northern Bhar el Ghazal States

ii) Strengthening emergency response to livestock diseases in South Sudan. As much as the activities undertaken have already been partially or completely concluded, however key project results are still remaining to be finalized. The main impediment for the realization of results was the eruption of political instability that emerged in Mid December 2013 in Juba and spread to other parts of South Sudan.

The impact of the conflict has disrupted mobilization of stakeholders and beneficiaries for timely implementation of this project. This therefore means that the remaining key results would not be managed within the remaining timeframe in May 15th 2014. Hence, additional 3 months is therefore requested in order to effectively realize the project outcomes.

Out of \$ 420,000 budget about 76% have been spent (including commitment) and 24% unspent. The remaining \$ 99.971 would be utilized to accomplish the remaining results by end on August 15th 2014. FAO therefore, requests if security allows an additional 3 months period from May 15th up to August 15th 2014 to enable partners and FAO complete the key activities of building resilience of stakeholders to threats of food crop and livestock diseases for increased food availability through distribution, production of disease free and clean planting materials and also control livestock diseases through livestock vaccination in South Sudan.
