# Description and justification of requested change

The project duration as stipulated on project partnership agreement is from 1October 2013 to 30 June 2014. After obtaining the fund from donor on 16 October 2013, the organization was engaged in recruiting staffs, purchasing of some office materials and generator and mobilizing to project area. To reprioritize the schools and secure the contribution of the community during implementation of the project, ManiTese conducted meeting with commissioner of Pariang County and representative of Ministry of education of the area.

After identifying the schools taking in consideration number of students per class room, and sanitation condition of each school, necessary preparations were carried out until the civil war erupted and suspend overall project activities. The unexpected force majeure caused the area to be inaccessible and renders the project to be lagged behind for 3 months (15 December 2013 to 15 March 2014).

After calm down of the conflict and realizing accessibility of the area, ManiTese conducted a brief assessment at the end of February and started to plan project activities (procurements, etc.). Sending necessary assorted materials and contractor to project site amid the war erupted again on the 14-15 of April 2014 leading the capital city of the state to fall under the SPLM-opposition. The truck filled with construction materials is presently stuck in Quajok and cannot reach the area of Pariang for security reason and rebel forces along the road. Fearing the advancement of opponents towards Pariang, the inhabitants of the area are in high tension and insecurity prevailed. Currently the staffs of ManiTese on the ground are moving assets of the organization from the office in Pariang to UNMISS compound. We are evacuating all Pariang Staff on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of April with UNHAS flight as, for the information we received, the situation on the ground is worsening.

Considering the consequence of the war on the project, ManiTese is kindly requesting No Cost Extension up to September 30, 2014 to finalize the already started project.

The chances to complete the project within the proposed date will be conditioned to the improvement of the security situation in the area and roads access during the upcoming rainy season.

#### List activities that were implemented during project period:

- Reassessment was conducted on the pre-selected schools to identify the aftermath of the war
- Because of security situation in Bentiu the office is relocated to Pariang County and furnished with some furniture and stationeries to replace the looted ones.
- Moving the vehicle of the organization from Bentiu (which was rescued in UNMISS compound) to Pariang county
- Mobilization of staffs from Bentiu to Pariang County where direct implementation is going on.
- Recruiting community focal persons from each payam and conduct orientation about the overall idea of the project.
- Market assessment and procurement of necessary materials to construct semi permanent classrooms and toilets
- Transportation of construction materials from Juba to Pariang
- · Selecting and mobilizing a contractor to the project area
- Coordination with other actors in the state as well as with education cluster coordinator of Unity state is ongoing
