Project Description: The overarching objective of this project is to facilitate Nepal's complex post-conflict transition by fostering collaboration among a broad range of leaders and community representatives to resolve disputes, develop shared agendas, and improve public security at the community level. To achieve this, the project will support the application of capacities in structured dialogue, mediation and conflict management to resolve disputes and reach consensus-based decisions on critical transition issues in Nepal. It will also reduce armed and gender-based violence and improve community security through building trust, dialogue and collaboration between communities and security providers and strengthening security agencies' knowledge and skills on community security approaches. It will also empower women and vulnerable groups to lead and play active roles in peacebuilding, security and development processes and enhance national capacity to deliver National Action Plan commitments on Security Council Resolutions 1325 and 1820.
