Preliminary work was completed in March. Implementation is almost going to completion with realisation of almost all the activities and with an implementation rate of about 95%. A catch-up plan that was put in place is being respected in order to ensure that the implementation proceeds in comprehensive, cost-effective and timely ways. Key community mechanisms in targeted project locations have been strengthened in communication and how to identify and respond to GBV issues and human rights violations in their various communities. These community mechanisms have been strongly involved in the fight of GBV through referrals and support provision. Also, vulnerable women and girls have had access to GBV holistic services through the safe space in Douala and case management services by the case workers. This involves a range of tasks that can be encompassed within a project cycle.

Up to 250 government officials and representatives of the civil society have already been trained and supported and an advocacy is being held to make sure the agenda of gender based violence and human rights is kept in the peacebuilding agenda in the country. At this pace, implementation will rate of 100% will be realised by the end of the project.

The project has made significant changes in the coordination between civil society organisations and the government in handling social issues specifically gender based violence and human rights. It has been a very interesting tool used to have these stakeholders work together in the fights against the crisis in the north west and south west and in other regions hosting IDPs.

The implication of all the stakeholders at local and strategic levels is helping to keep the issue discussed and victims are assisted the more. The catalytic effect of the funds has helped the 3 implementation UN agencies to reorientate additional funds to the project activities which are not yet to be stopped. A second edition of the National Action plan of the 1325 Resolution has been elaborated and its implementation started.

Within the frame work of the implementation of the Peacebuilding Fund project with coordination of UNFPA and its implementing partners COMINSUD and LUKMEF, the following has been realized.

More than 95% of activities have been realised with ongoing awareness raising sessions and ensuring care and access to justice of SGBV Survivors is reduced. All training sessions have been finalised within this quarter. RESPOND sought to build upon existing efforts, strengthen local capacity, and initiate or contribute to a process of change that extends beyond the duration of the project. This will go a long way to provide help to survivors of GBV, and aim to shift social norms by promoting gender equality and behavioural change through strong partnerships with civil society organizations.

It is important to understanding unique family structures and cultural norms of various ethno-religious communities and engage family and tribal mechanisms as allies in enhancing women's access to services. SGBV services have been mapped out. Two workshops were organized in Bafoussam and Douala for the update and validation of the referral pathways. It is a flexible mechanism that safely links survivors to supportive and competent services in a timely way. The Referral Pathway facilitates primary duty bearers and actors with information on how to respond to GBV cases and to guide the victims/ survivors of GBV on where to seek assistance and what services are available at different referral points. 10,000 copies of the referral pathways have been printed and distributed in the different communities.

The communication capacities of 10 community based associations have been strengthened. The trained local organisations will jointly support in the fight against GBV and will then work with local authorities and other community stakeholders to train additional members of their communities, perform local awareness and mobilization campaigns to monitor the incidence of GBV, encourage the use of existing support services for GBV victims, and to change the social norms and attitudes surrounding GBV more broadly.

Outreach activities also been organized for young people, women, men, persons living with disabilities, host populations, local authorities and community leaders on: the consequences GBV on the health care systems, referral systems of SGBV survivors, and

Existing legal and judicial services, reaching out to thousands of persons. 1290 dignity kits have been distributed to 1290 women and girls according to vulnerability criteria. Dignity kits help women and girls by;

- **Contributing to the psychosocial and physical wellbeing of women and girls, by including items such as intimate wash and pads,**
- **Improving mobility of women and girls by providing specific sanitary items.**
- **Contributing to the protection of women and girls, by including items such as flashlights and whistles, so that women and girls do not have to walk in the dark and can call for help**

06 municipal action plans on the protection and participation of women and young girls in decision-making bodies relating to the prevention and management of conflicts drawn up is put in place - 01 HeforShe advocacy document targeting related themes protection of women in times of conflict for the consolidation of peace developed - 03 HeForShe campaigns targeting themes related to the protection of women in times of conflict for the consolidation of peace carried out - Cases of community law have been implemented for the benefit of the municipalities of Babadjou, Bafoussam 1st, Bafoussam 2nd and Bafoussam 3rd.

A safety audit assessment was carried out in the West region to assess the GBV risk in areas 50 community health workers were trained on identification, listening, counseling and referral techniques for survivors of GBV/SEA as well as psychosocial first aid (PFA) to facilitate care and access to GBV survivors. Capacities of service providers were strengthened to provide multi-sectorial services including referrals (medical, psychosocial, GBV case management, legal and judicial). This has enhanced the knowledge of Service Providers on what are referrals, and what is the Referral Pathway, improve the knowledge of Service Providers on safe referrals and referral flow chart and to understand the steps to do safe referrals.

202 GBV survivors have been capacitated and supported on income generating activities. This has helped to empower survivors and helping them to create positive coping mechanisms to solve their problems. A good number of success stories have been recorded.
