With respect to preliminary activities, IOM completed contracting Social Inquiry as their implementing partner for the data component of this project in early 2022 and have been collaborating since. The status of the project is on track with a slight delay, need for finalization of the workplan and inputs from Darfur colleagues into the forthcoming technical note. These are critical in order to gain further common agreement, ahead of consulting with local authorities and communities for the first phase of the project (Outcome 1). This will proceed in the coming months ahead of planned data collection after the rainy season.

UNHCR Sudan is finalizing the Terms of Reference (TORs) on the Cross-Border project to be used for the implementation of the refugee component of the data collection in Chad. UNHCR Chad will implement the data collection through the national statistics office in Chad. UNHCR Chad is also in communication with the Office of the resident coordinator to ensure linkages with other PBF projects in Chad.

UNCHR, IOM, and their implementing partner Social Inquiry held an initial kick-off call with PBF counterparts in February 2022, including the need to revise the workplan to align better to overall project goals. IOM via Social Inquiry submitted a narrative workplan detailing the steps of work under this outcome to UNHCR to start this revision process as agreed by all counterparts during early meetings on this. Based on internal discussion with the UNHCR focal point, Social Inquiry developed an initial technical design presentation for further discussion to adapt the data and analysis strategy of Outcome 1 given the changes in Sudan context since the development of the project proposal, with less emphasis on return per se and on solutions more broadly on peace, cohesion, and security dimensions included. This was presented to PBF colleagues as well as to UNHCR Darfur and IOM Darfur colleagues for further discussion and refinement during a planned travel mission to Sudan in April 2022. Because these more technical aspects still needed to be adapted and agreed upon, considering inputs from Darfur colleagues to ensure research is not duplicative and is context- and conflict-sensitive and appropriately includes nomadic communities (both settled and still moving), UNHCR, IOM, and Social Inquiry decided to postpone consultations with local authorities and communities until the finalized technical note is produced and indicators framework and tools further advanced. The technical note will be submitted by Social Inquiry by the end of May 2022 to the UNHCR and IOM for their final review and further approval from PBF. The initial indicators framework is forthcoming as well. Social Inquiry, in coordination with IOM, will take the lead in developing the framework as agreed during the April 2022 consultations with Darfur colleagues and will then circulate to the UNHCR for inputs and revisions with the aim of finalizing it for use in both Sudan and Chad (adapting it to the Chad context as needed). Further consultations are planned for summer 2022 to gain additional insight into indicators and data collection planned for autumn 2022 after the rainy season.

UNHCR Sudan is finalizing the Terms of Reference (TORs) on the Cross-Border project to be used for the implementation of the refugee component of the data collection in Chad. UNHCR Chad will implement the data collection through the national statistics office in Chad. UNHCR Chad is also in communication with the Office of the Resident Coordinator to ensure linkages with other PBF projects in Chad.

The sampling strategy for the data collection and analysis includes quotas for gender and age already and will also include specific strategies for nomadic communities. From discussions with UNHCR Darfur and IOM Darfur colleagues, they have indicated good contacts with local community structures including women-, youth-, and nomad-led groups or organizations across the three target states in Darfur for further consultation to ensure their inclusion in this effort and relevant analysis for these populations. Similarly such discussions are being had with UNHCR Chad.
