

The project supported the drafting of the first Human Rights national Strategic Plan of Guinea-Bissau, which was approved on 6 October 2022 by the council of Minister. Now, the project is supporting the dissemination and implementation of the National Action Plan. Thirty-seven State institutions and CSOs are implementing a coordinated incident reporting mechanism on child protection cases (using ICT innovations/Tablets), with the project's support. This will strengthen the capacity of child rights stakeholders to monitor progress towards the realization of child rights, including national reporting to human rights treaty bodies and commissions. the draft report for the CRC Committee is almost finalised. The project has contributed to increase awareness of GB's obligations in terms of reporting to treaty bodies. two ad hoc working groups for reporting to the Human Rights Committee and the Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights that are functional with support of the project. The capacity of members of both groups was strengthened including in the context of a training seminar delivered with the support of two UN human rights experts, a current member of the Human Rights Committee (on civil and political rights) and a former chair of the Committee on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights on how the reports should be prepared.

Finally the project is also preparing the ground to ensure stakeholders involved in the upcoming elections are equipped with knowledge on human rights standards applicable in the context of elections.

The project has supported trainings on the use of data collection tools/case incident on violence, abuse and exploitation of children for Case management workers from different Child rights organizations in Bissau and three regions namely Bafata, Gabu and Cacheu. The training was carried out by the Women and Child Institute – IMC. It aims to improve coordination, complementarity, and collaboration among child protection structures in collecting and systematizing data on violence against children in the country.

The project has worked towards including a gender lens (and the inclusion of women and girls) in all the projects' activities. Women were included in the ad hoc working groups for the preparation of the reports and special attention was given to the international covenant on civil and political Rights report. UNDP' inclusion specialist attended the discussion to ensure that the needs of women and girls and other discriminated groups were considered. The draft of the new statute of the Commission on Human Rights takes into consideration the importance of gender equality and the project will work towards supporting its approval in the National Assembly. Furthermore, the National Strategy on Human Rights that was approved in October, highlights the need to work to promote the rights of women and girls. Additionally, the project is working on including women and gender equality concerns in all its activities. On the work being developed on human rights defenders, one of the goals has been to work with women human rights defenders (WHRD) as well. The 2 consultants hired have as one of their tasks to identify WHRDs and their specific issues/problems in the context of Guinea-Bissau.


