The Secretariat hosted monthly meetings with all project teams. In June a coordination meeting was held, bringing together all project teams.

The secretariat designed and delivered on May 2022 an online session to all recipient organizations on issues concerning M&E practices and to support project teams in drafting progress reports. In October, before the reporting period, a meeting was held with each team and technical support on reporting requirements was provided. The Secretariat is currently providing support and revising all draft annual reports, and now expects to receive their final version for approval before the upload on the MPTFO Gateway by the 15th of November.

Following the reactivation of the PBF Joint Steering Committee organized by the PBF Secretariat in June 2021, the Secretariat has been keeping the PBF JSC abreast of all PBF developments, ensuring its members' recommendations concerning the new areas of investment informed by the PBSO are taken into consideration during the identification of new projects ideas. This activity brought the JSC members closer to the Secretariat and to the institutions developing projects, allowing further awareness of the PBF Secretariat's work and the current PBF portfolio, enabling them to accomplish their oversight and orientation role.

Under the PRF project identification process, Four Proposals were reviewed and refined the concept notes before submission to the RC and PBSO.

All the inception ideas of these projects were discussed and refined in the "project clinics" organized by the PBF Secretariat and facilitated by the international consultant hired to reinforce the stakeholder capacity on peacebuilding project design and implementation and, each project drafting team received tailored and in-person guidance and support for the concept note finalization from the PBSO colleague. The Secretariat supported the 2022 GYPI process. A work plan was organized for the call and information was widely shared with the UNCT. 4 Concept Notes were submitted by UNFPAs to the RC. PBF secretariat reached out to national CSOs to disseminate the GYPI, organizing 1 meeting with 23 national CSOs in the country One GYPI project proposed by the UNCT was submitted for PBSO perusal.

The international consultant hired, provided tailored support to teams that were drafting project proposals. The consultancy allowed the capacitation to UN agencies, CSOs, and Government in designing new PBF projects but also to plan and implement peacebuilding projects that effectively address structural and systemic threats to sustainable peace at policy, implementation, and monitoring levels securing more resources for the Country and ensured further Government and relevant local actors working on peacebuilding engagement. (act. 2.1.1. and 2.1.2.).

#### PBF Secretariat has been:

- Requiring (and supporting the development of) project management basic instruments (annual workplans and M&E plans) in the first quarter of implementation and, has been supporting the project teams developing the tools to conduct the baseline study;
- Organizing project monthly monitoring and regular coordination meetings to allow greater synergy between project team members;

A National Communications & Visibility Specialist was hired to provide support to the PBF Secretariat and to assist PBF-funded projects in developing communication-related products, articulating and disseminating more and better information on their works, and achievement to the UNCT, projects' partners, and local stakeholders. For four consecutive months, the PBF Secretariat has been sharing the main achievements of the portfolio each month, increasing UNCT's knowledge of the PBF work and its impact on the country's peacebuilding landscape.

The Secretariat was able to identify and profile the main CSOs working on the peacebuilding field in the country. The results will be transferred to a database and publicly shared, ensuring facilitating the knowledge and contact of the CSO with the project planning to implement or implementing PBF-funded project at the local level.

The Secretariat conducted monitoring visits to regions where PBF-funded activities are taking place. All testimonies and investments of the PBF in the last two years were recorded, edited into short videos for each project.

To ensure project-level visibility and promote effective joint implementation, the Secretariat produced basic visibility materials for each project, based on the PBF visibility guidance note.

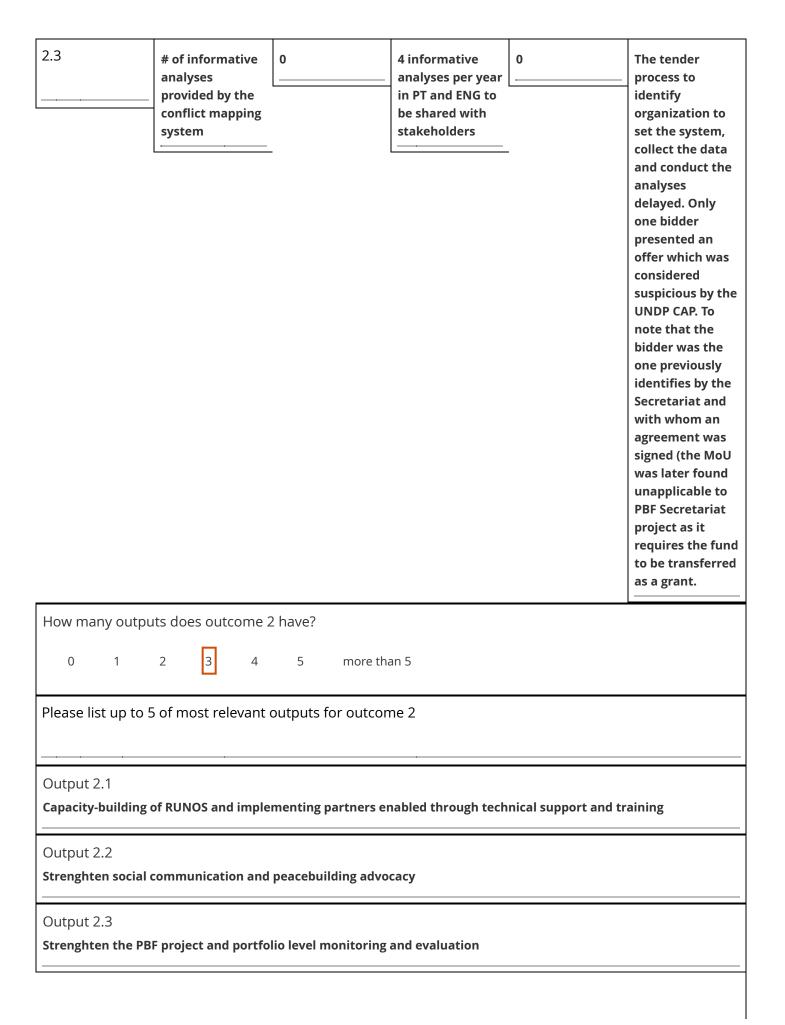
