The project has a Board that comprises several government ministries and agencies including the Ministry of Finance and Development Planning (MFDP), the Ministry of Internal Affairs (MIA), Independent National Commission on Human Rights (INCHR), the Kofi Annan Institute of Conflict Transformation (KAICT) at the University of Liberia (UL) and the Peacebuilding Office (PBO). Earlier in the year, the project held its board meeting where its annual work plan was discussed and approved. Subsequently, the project team has continued to engage with the Ministry of Internal Affairs through the PBO and the University of Liberia through KAICT to implement planned activities. Engagement with the MIA and UL has involved meeting and working with local authorities including county superintendents and chiefs to discuss issues relative to peace, reconciliation and social cohesion. The PBO and KAICT led several consultations and dialogues with members of academia, community members and local authorities to discuss the county peace and reconciliation plans and the national reconciliation roadmap-discussing the contents and implementation of these key documents. The meeting with the local leaders and community members on the county peace and reconciliation plans led to the development of county action plans to implement the county peace and reconciliation plans for each of the 15 counties.





All key preliminary/preparatory activities of the project have been completed. The recruitment of project staff by the two recipient institutions (UNDP and FAO) have been concluded. Further, the project contracted implementing partners including civil society organizations and national partners to support the implementation of the project. UNDP recruited and signed partnership agreements with Naymote Partners for Democratic Development, Platform for Dialogue and Peace and Liberia Initiative for Empowerment and one international non-governmental organization (Center for Humanitarian Dialogue). UNDP also signed a memorandum of understanding with the Peacebuilding Office and the University of Liberia to carry out some of the planned activities. The partners have implemented several planned activities including national and community dialogues on peace, reconciliation and social cohesion; regional level dialogues on the county peace and reconciliation plans; and the strategic reconciliation roadmap. These partners are also working with conflict prone communities to identify and support initiatives that will promote peace, social cohesion and reconciliation in communities and Liberia at large.

FAO signed a partnership agreement with Peace Dividends Initiative (PDI) to promote peace, social cohesion and reconciliation by providing livelihood and income generating assistance to women, men and youth in conflict prone communities. FAO and PDI will create a platform to promote social cohesion and peace by supporting women groups and small businesses using the Village Saving and Loan Association scheme (VSLA) and the incubation and growth of business ideas and plans.

The project is making significant progress towards informing national reconciliation in Liberia, especially in counties where the project is implemented. With the support of the project, communities that have been engulfed into inter and intra conflicts are now dialoguing to find sustainably amicable solutions to their conflict and live together in peace. For example, in Sinoe Counties, two communities-Butaw and Morryville, have been at loggerhead over land occupation and use for over ten years. Due to the conflict, the two communities have had difficulties in interacting and co-existing with each other. With the support of the project including facilitating dialogues between the two communities, the communities have agreed to resolve the problem peacefully including signing a memorandum of understanding (MoU) and inviting the Liberia Land Authority (LLA) to demarcate the land as a way of resolving the land conflict. To reduce tension and maintain calm, the communities agreed to have a 'stay where you are order' until the MoU is signed and the demarcation by the LLA is carried out. This has helped to stop further escalation in the conflict and promoted social cohesion within and between the two communities.

Similarly, the project has contributed to the enhancement of peace and social cohesion in Nimba County through the dialogues, training and establishment of community peace structure (the Nimba Youth United for Peace and Development-NYUPD). The local leaders and NYUPD members are using the knowledge and skills gained to resolve disputes and conduct awareness on promoting peace, social cohesion and reconciliation. These efforts are contributing to maintaining peace and enhancing social ties among community members. During the period, for example, these local leaders and members of the Youth Committee have helped to resolve seven (7) disputes. This has helped to maintain peace and promote social cohesion and reconciliation in the benefiting communities.

The project has ensured the inclusion and empowerment of women and youth in interventions aimed at achieving this outcome. UNDP, FAO and partners have deliberately targeted women and youth in every aspect of the project. In Grand Gedeh and Sinoe Counties, for instance, the project targeted and empowered women groups with small grants to engage in income generating and livelihood activities to foster social cohesion and peace in the communities. similarly, in Lofa and Nimba, women and youth groups have been empowered with grants to implement income generating and livelihood activities. Before the disbursement of the peace dividends grants, beneficiaries were trained on several key aspects of peacebuilding including alternative dispute resolution, peace, social cohesion and reconciliation. The youth and women groups are using the grants as a means to bring together women and youth from different socio-cultural backgrounds to interact with one another, discuss issues and take collective actions to promote social cohesion, reconciliation and peace. These women and youth are currently using the skills and knowledge acquired to conduct awareness on promoting peace and resolving disputes.

The project is making some steady progress towards promoting reconciliation and social cohesion through local and regional projects. The project has contributed to increased social cohesion and reconciliation in targeted conflict prone communities through the provision of grants to support community driven initiatives that are now serving as media for interaction among different segments of the communities, particularly women and youth from different socio-cultural backgrounds. The project has provided grant facility to youth and women groups that are not only engaged in livelihood and income generating activities but are creating awareness on peace, social cohesion and reconciliation within their communities and promoting peace through the peace resolution of disputes using the alternative dispute resolution (ADR) approach. The grants provided by the project and used to support community self-identified projects are yielding dividends of peace for the people in the community. Members of the various groups who are from different ethnic, cultural and social backgrounds meet often to carry out business on behalf of their groups, discuss issues affecting their communities, engage in community awareness and resolve disputes in their communities. to some extent, this has contributed to making their communities more united and reconciled as they work together and take collective action to address their differences.

As stated inter alias, the project has ensured the meaningful inclusion, participation and empowerment of women and youth in the implementation of interventions aimed at achieving project results including its outcomes and outputs. The provision of grants to support local projects has hugely targeted women and youth in the project counties. In Grand Gedeh and Sinoe, the four groups provided technical and financial supports are women and youth groups. Each of the groups is composed of 10 members and all women. In like manner, women and youth groups were targeted and benefited from the grant facility in Lofa and Nimba. In Lofa and Nimba, 40 women and 20 youth benefited from the peace dividends grants, with 58 women and 2 men overall benefiting from the grants. Beneficiaries are using the grants to implement income generating and livelihood activities that do not only earn them incomes to dispose on their family but help to give them options and reduce their susceptibility to abuse and violence. The youth and women groups are using the grants as a means to come together from different sociocultural backgrounds to interact with one another, discuss issues and take collective actions to promote social cohesion, reconciliation and peace. These are also using the skills and knowledge acquired to conduct awareness on promoting peace and resolving disputes.

Long standing land and boundary dispute spanning more than one decade between Butaw and Morryville communities, resulting in acrimonious relationship between their citizens and residents. Consequently, there has been occasional violence, deep disunity and hatred between residents of the two sides, making coexistence among them almost impossible.

What has been the impact of the project on their lives

The project has helped to improve relationship between the two communities whereby citizens and residents including local leaders and members of the communities are now interacting and engaging with one another on issues of common interest. The project facilitated series of dialogues between the two communities through which they agreed on peacefully resolving their disputes. They agreed to sign a memorandum of understanding (MoU) and invite the Liberia Land Authority (LLA) to demarcate the land. They also agreed to institute a 'stay where you are' order to deescalate the problem and pave the way for the signing of the MoU and the demarcation of the land by LLA.

"We have been attending plenty land meetings organized by different groups and even the land authority people about this Butaw and Morryville land boundary issues. But what I see here today, we haven't seen or experienced it before at any land meeting in this community. I think, we have achieved today, so as we agree, let everyone 'remain where they are' until we can let the government people know what we have agreed on to amicably settle this land dispute once and for all. The project has, as part of its design and implementation strategy, an explicit sustainability plan. The sustainability plan includes working with local authorities and community members to design and implement locally driven projects that are expected to outlive the life span of the project. The project identified and organized women and youth into groups and provided them with technical and financial support, which has enabled them to collectively work together to promote social cohesion, reconciliation, and peace. They are using the grants and the knowledge and skills gained to engage in livelihood and income generating activities, as well as to create awareness on peace, social cohesion and reconciliation. Given that these groups are within their communities and have acquired needed skills, knowledge and finances to engage in meaningful activities like business, it is very likely that they will continue to exist even after the project is closed. This will contribute to sustaining the impacts of key interventions

of the project.

Are there any other issues concerning project implementation that you want to share, including any capacity needs of the recipient organizations?

Given that Liberia is still a fragile country there is an immense need to continue to nurture the peace and security that exist at the moment. Moreover, Liberia is at a crucial stage in its democratic governance with an upcoming presidential and legislative elections in 2023. In addition, the project is working with community groups that have limited capacity to perform its functions to promote peace, social cohesion and reconciliation. These factors and concerns require deliberate, long-term support to train, mentor and strengthen the capacity of community structures to contribute to promoting and maintaining peace in Liberia. In so doing, the project does not only need to be scaled up but also needs to be extended beyond the current life span with additional funding in order to provide adequate support to grassroot groups to promote and maintain peace and stability in the country.
