Women in uniform became more 'visible' after the formation of the SSWN that represents 178 women security sector actors across the country. The SSWN continues to gain awareness, visibility, and recognition which contributes to strengthening of the gender responsiveness and accountability of the security sector. Newly 30 women have been deployed in the special protection units (SPUs) across 10 states and one administrative area in the reporting period that enabled them to increase gender sensitivity in investigations involving survivors of SGBV.

The general security in communities has improved with women reporting an increased sense of safety and security as they carry out their daily activities. Over 500 (48% female, 52% male) community members and the uniformed forces who participated in 16 consultations in the project area reported the relationship between the military and civilians has been improved. The uniformed forces and community members now conduct joint patrols to prevent cases of sexual and gender-based violence (SGBV) in their communities and the community members are now able to report rape cases with confidence to the authorities and collaborate with the security forces during investigations which was not the case prior to the project intervention.

Civil relations with uniformed forces within the security sector institutions has been improved and enabled persons with disabilities voice their views on how the security sector institutions can better support and safeguard the security of persons with disabilities. The partnership between the two groups demonstrated to the society that persons with disabilities have the same standing in the community like any other person.

During the exchange learning visits to Rwanda and Ghana between March and April 2022, there was a gender split for the participants - out of the 19 participants, there were 10 females and 9 males. For the national consultations for the development of the NAP on Gender and SSR, women formed the bulk (over 60%) of those consulted because the NAP is about addressing most of the issues in the security sector that affect them.

The communities were not able to report crimes such as sexual and gender-based violence, burglary to the security forces because of distrust. The uniformed forces were hostile to the communities where there were active armed rebellions. The communities too reciprocated this attitude and women suffered more through rapes and harassments.

After conducting dialogues between and community members and the security forces about their gender and security needs and the subsequent formation of the community-security forces' committees who conduct joint patrols, trust and good relationship between communities and security forces is now restored.

During monitoring visits conducted in Yei and Yambio in Central and Western Equatoria States respectively, focus group discussions were done with the beneficiaries of the project. The participants of the focus group discussions were unanimous in their assessment about how the relationship and trust between the communities and the uniformed forces had improved considerably. They claimed that this has as well led to the reduction in cases of SGBV in these areas as the security forces have become more respectful of communities' women. 1

Women in uniform were marginalized as men occupy higher positions. Women's needs within the security sector institutions were not paid attention and addressed.

Through gender sensitivity trainings conducted across the country, men and women in uniform have become aware about women's rights and needs. Some senior men in uniform promised after the workshops that they would immediately implement reforms that are responsive to women's security needs in their respective units.

The learning exchange visits conducted to Rwanda and Ghana for the members of the South Sudan People's Defense Forces (SSPDF) have been an eye-opener. The visits were done for the members of the SSPDF to learn about the various ways in which gender was mainstreamed within the security sector in the respective countries. Reports were produced by those who visited these countries and submitted to the Minister of Defense and Veterans Affairs who vowed to implement the recommendations from the exchange visits.

The formation of South Sudan Security Sector Women's Networks have also gone a long way in opening the eyes of the women in uniform and have given them the platform to advocate for their rights and act as role models for the young women and girls who would want to join the security sector. These women have already initiated and conducted 3 advocacy campaigns to showcase their relevance.
