


THE YEAR 2022...

marked significant achievements for the <u>Complex Risk</u> <u>Analytics Fund (CRAF'd)</u>. Driven by the ambition to finance, connect, and reimagine data to save lives, CRAF'd partners committed **almost \$20 million in allocations to improve crisis action worldwide**. CRAF'd investments secured critical risk datasets as a common good, advanced groundbreaking analytics on climate fragility, and built a stronger global risk data ecosystem. Less than a year after the Fund's launch, more than 40,000 users in over 100 organizations are now using CRAF'd-supported data and insights. As a result, nearly \$10 billion in annual crisis assistance reaches people earlier, faster, and in a more targeted and dignified way. Building on this momentum, the CRAF'd has directly enabled its partners to better anticipate, prevent, and respond to crises worldwide.






FINANCE DATA TO SAVE LIVES



In 2022, CRAF'd focused its initial investments on critical risk datasets to unlock their full potential. To this end, **CRAF'd partners jointly committed nearly \$15 million** to the **Armed Conflict Location & Event Data Project** (ACLED) - the world's leading real-time dataset on conflict. Securing ACLED as a common good has been critical for hundreds of partners, providing them with the data they need to respond to and anticipate crises. For example, the World Food Program uses ACLED data to better anticipate food insecurity around the world and target its assistance to 160 million people. With CRAF'd funding, ACLED has expanded its geographic coverage, improved public access to its data, including through the <u>Humanitarian Data Exchange</u>, trained hundreds of partners, and developed new tools to help partners monitor, anticipate, and track conflicts.


CONNECT DATA TO SAVE LIVES



In 2022, CRAF'd expanded its ecosystem of stakeholders, ending the year with over **20 core partner organizations** across the UN family, Member States, and non-governmental organizations. New donor partners joined CRAF'd, contributing almost **\$11 million to a stronger data ecosystem** — including the European Union, Finland, Germany, the Netherlands, and the United States by the end of 2022.


The broader network and additional funding allowed CRAF'd to build more robust connections between stakeholders throughout the year. For example, CRAF'd partnered with the World Bank's **Global Data Facility**, to launch the **Data with Purpose** campaign. More than **10,000 people attended events** during the **Spring Meetings of the World Bank** and the 77th Session of the United Nations General Assembly to learn how data, analytics, and artificial intelligence (AI) can help save lives and livelihoods.

REIMAGINE DATA TO SAVE LIVES




Investing in new approaches to data is a core purpose of CRAF'd. In 2022, the Fund launched its first open call for proposals for analytics and AI to better address the impacts of climate change in crisis settings. More than 60 organizations responded to the highly competitive call. With the support of leading experts, **CRAF'd partners awarded over \$4 million to renowned organizations**, including the International Crisis Group, the Peace Research Institute Oslo, the Norwegian Refugee Council, and several UN organizations. The investments cover climate security early warning systems, multi-hazard risk monitors, and new geospatial insight tools.

SCALE CRAF'd IMPACT IN 2023 AND BEYOND



With strong foundations in place, CRAF'd partners are now preparing to scale their impact. Several new goals are on the horizon: **Mobilizing at least \$20 million annually with the support of new partners**, launching at least **two calls for proposals** per year, and developing a **new strategy** that will guide CRAF'd investments to support an ever-growing ecosystem of partners, unlock more value from data, and save more lives.

CRAF'd THEORY OF CHANGE

When it comes to data, analytics, and artificial intelligence, **pooling resources via joint financing is the most efficient strategy**. CRAF'd enables partners to reduce financial transaction costs, minimize duplication, scale up groundbreaking data investments, and secure data as a common good. Ultimately, the Fund helps unlock more resources for crisis action: With more than \$30 billion invested in global emergency response each year, **every 1 percent in data-driven improvements translates into \$300 million in gains for people and the planet** – as a result of earlier, faster, and more targeted action.

CONNECT DATA TO SAVE LIVES

CRAF'd champions an ecosystem approach that recognizes the **interconnected nature of risks in crisis settings**. By investing in an extensive network of diverse stakeholders – **donors, UN entities, NGOs, academia, and technology partners** – CRAF'd helps connect data and that often remain locked in silos. These connections deliver tangible benefits, such as predicting food insecurity risks more accurately with the help of conflict data or enhanced crisis operations with more accurate estimates of affected populations.




REIMAGINE DATA TO SAVE LIVES

CRAF'd is designed to help partners harness this potential at scale – in an open, secure, and responsible way. By pooling resources, CRAF'd partners can scale their investments, share risks, and sustain benefits long-term, leading the way in cutting-edge crisis action.

has demonstrated its commitment to secure data as a common good with a first significant investment of \$15 million over two years in the <u>Armed Conflict Location & Event Data Project (ACLED)</u>. ACLED is the world's **leading source of real-time conflict data**, supporting major early warning and early action systems across the globe.

PROVIDING RELIABLE CONFLICT DATA WORLDWIDE

With CRAF'd funding, ACLED was able to continue providing real-time, disaggregated data worldwide. CRAF'd support also enabled ACLED's **40,000 users to generate insights that feed directly into evidence-based policymaking, strategic planning, and effective programming processes** around the world.

ENABLING DEEPER INSIGHTS THROUGH ANALYTICAL TOOLS

CRAF'd support was instrumental in advancing **new ACLED initiatives**, such as the **Local Observatories**, which enhance data collection in low-information settings; the pioneering of the **Conflict Severity Index**, which measures the complexity of conflicts; and the development of the **Conflict Alert System**, which helps **forecast potential crises up to 6 months in advance**.

EXPANDING THE CRAF'D ECOSYSTEM

CRAF'd funding enabled ACLED to expand the global risk data ecosystem. By formalizing partnerships with new organizations, ACLED facilitates **data sharing, collaborative analysis, and co-development** of public data products. In 2022, ACLED joined forces with <u>WorldPop</u> to develop a groundbreaking dataset to help partners better understand how conflict affects populations.

EMPOWERING PARTNERS AND USERS

With CRAF'd support, ACLED continued to build partner capacity by **training hundreds of users** in data methodology, analysis, and visualization for hundreds of users.

HOW ACLED BRINGS CLARITY TO CRISES WITH DATA

ACLED is the leading source of real-time conflict data. It powers most global early warning and action tools. ACLED collects comprehensive data on the dates, actors, locations, fatalities, and types of all reported political violence and protest events in 243 countries and territories. Drawing on a broad network of partners and researchers, ACLED provides detailed, accurate, and timely conflict data and analysis that is freely available to the public.



Conflict is a major cause of food insecurity worldwide. The World Food Programme (WFP) uses ACLED data as a key component of its forecasting efforts, allowing it to optimally **support more than 160** million people. For example, in the WFP <u>HungerMap</u> users can explore how ACLED supports real-time insights into food insecurity in nearly 100 countries and territories worldwide. With data powered by CRAF'd, WFP is enhancing the allocation of over **\$10 billion in annual assistance** - reaching people in need earlier, faster, and in a more targeted and dignified way.

IN 2022...

CRAF'd increased the reach and impact of its mission: to **expand and connect committed partners in a scalable, sustainable, and well-governed ecosystem**. More than **20 organizations** are now part of the CRAF'd ecosystem, including twelve from the UN family. Through joint efforts, CRAF'd partners have also made significant progress in leveraging additional resources.

EXPANDING THE PARTNERSHIP

The CRAF'd ecosystem experienced significant growth, ending the year with **more than 20 partner organizations across the UN family, Member States, and NGOs.** Three additional UN organizations – United Nations Children's Fund, Food and Agriculture Organization, and International Telecommunication Union – joined CRAF'd in 2022, each bringing unique expertise and networks. This continued expansion not only validates the growing impact of CRAF'd, but also enriches the ecosystem's diversity and depth of the ecosystem.

MOBILIZING CONTRIBUTIONS

Throughout 2022, CRAF'd made significant progress in mobilizing resources. Generous support from **Finland, Germany, the Netherlands, and the United States** laid the groundwork for CRAF'd to scale impact. Their substantial support was complemented by a pledge for 2023 from the **European Union**. By the end of 2022, **CRAF'd had received almost \$11 million in contributions** and catalyzed additional commitments to reach the **funding target of \$20 million** per year.

CRAF'd and the World Bank's <u>Global Data Facility</u> launched the <u>Data With Purpose</u> campaign. Guided by the visionary leadership of UN Deputy Secretary-General Amina J. Mohamed and World Bank Managing Director Mari Elka Pangestu, the campaign **connected key players across the public and private sectors** to shine a spotlight on the transformative power of data.

DEEPENING THE DATA POTENTIAL CONVERSATION

At the Spring Meetings of the World Bank in April 2022, the campaign convened global leaders and influential stakeholders to advocate for robust financial support for data for crisis action. A new policy brief, "Unlocking Data for a Better, Greener, Safer Future", explained the value of better data infrastructure for people and the planet.

The momentum was carried forward to the 77th Session of the **United Nations General Assembly** with the high-profile event "<u>Unlocking Impact: Data with</u> <u>Purpose</u>". The **event attracted more than 10,000 viewers** and highlighted the importance of aligned finance, data, and people to address global challenges. At the heart of the event, a new Investment Case "<u>Multiplying Progress Through</u> <u>Data Ecosystems</u>" illustrated the message that **investing in data has multifold returns**. For every dollar invested in data, there are up to \$32 in benefits for societies, environments, and institutions.

the Fund's mission is the profound belief in the **transformative power of data**. Today, there are opportunities to access more data, better technology, and broader networks than ever before. By investing in **predictive analytics, machine learning, and AI** CRAF'd is helping to lift this potential in an open, secure, and responsible way.

TURNING DATA INTO INSIGHTS

In 2022, CRAF'd launched its first open call for proposals to find novel, data-driven solutions to climate-driven fragility and crisis. The response was extraordinary, with applications from **60 organizations across 30 countries**. The fact that the **funding envelope was more than ten times oversubscribed** illustrates the global demand and urgent need for data-driven approaches to crisis action.

Selected with the support of leading experts and scientists, the **six final projects are at the forefront of innovation.** The investments cover climate security, early warning systems, multi-hazard risk monitors, and new geospatial insight tools – all of which will also leverage existing CRAF'd investments.

reimagine crisis action, the CRAF'd Steering Committee convened for the first time in June 2022 to reaffirm commitment to the CRAF'd mission, allocate an initial \$15 million in funding to ACLED, and pave the way for the open call for proposals on climate fragility.

The <u>Multi-Partner Trust Fund Office</u> also participates as an ex-officio member without voting rights.

CRAF'd has entered a new phase of its journey. Having established a strong foundation in place and united partners behind a shared vision for data-driven crisis action, the Fund is poised to unlock even more value for crisis action:



SCALING INVESTMENTS

CRAF'd partners plan to launch **at least two open calls for proposals per year**. These calls will help support more essential risk datasets, groundbreaking analytics, and ecosystem investments. CRAF'd will continue to secure ACLED as a common good.



PARTNERSHIPS AND RESOURCE MOBILIZATION

CRAF'd will bridge data gaps and break down siloes by growing the core partnership to **over 30 organizations**, with a **goal of mobilizing more than \$20 million in annual contributions.** New alliances will strengthen the Fund's capabilities and expand its reach.



ECOSYSTEM STRATEGY

Working closely with global stakeholders, CRAF'd will develop a **new ecosystem strategy** to guide its investments. The goal is to foster collaboration, knowledge sharing, and cooperation among a broader range of stakeholders in crisis response and risk management over the long term.
