Several preliminary activities covering the launch, governance structures, recruitment, and work plans commenced in April 2023, with completion and ongoing action on the following activities:

The project was officially launched in June 2023 to ensure accountability to all stakeholders engaged in its implementation. It was a convening of 86 participants (67 women and 11 men) representing diverse stakeholders. The key stakeholders were from the Office of the Vice President (Gender and Youth Cluster), Government Ministries, the National Parliament (Women caucus, committees, and other parliamentarians), the African Union, National Constitutional Review Commission, women CSOs, political parties, the UN in South Sudan, donor representatives (The Netherlands, the EU, Swiss Cooperation, Norway, Sweden, and Canada) contributing to the Peacebuilding Fund (PBF) and the media.

The discussion highlighted the significance of co-creation and meaningful partnership for active and substantive roles and ownership of approaches, outcomes, and targets within the context analysis of women political participation.

Ongoing and upcoming activities include the following:

- Development of detailed and costed work plan
- Call for proposal to engage a responsible party for implementation to be finalized by the end of June.
- Recruitments of a National Programme Analyst position. Applications are under review.
- Recruitment of consultant to conduct a baseline study. Process has been initiated through the external advert.
- Completion of stakeholders mapping to support establishment of governance structures: National Steering Committee, Technical Committee, and Joint M&E team.
- Conduct of initial learning and listening session with South Sudan Women CSOs, women parliamentarians, Government Ministries (Peacebuilding, Parliamentary Affairs and Gender) to inform and guide inception activities on all outcomes.

The project's alignment with the strategic frameworks of the UN and the Government for the next three years (2023-2025) is strategic for sustainability, ownership, and lessons learned by all stakeholders, especially the Government of South Sudan. The project objectives support the South Sudan Vision 2040 and the 2021-2024 revised national development strategy (R-NDS). The R-NDS aims to consolidate peace, reduce the humanitarian footprint, stabilize the economy, and promote sustainable development. State-level development plans have integrated aspirations and goals of the R-NDS.

This context supports grassroots engagement and ownership by those directly affected by the challenges addressed in this project. The project aims to expand the pool of qualified and capable women to participation in advocacy for gender-responsive political processes, the 35% affirmative action quota and elections. Of critical note is the Government of South Sudan's indication its commitment to the peace and political process through its extended roadmap (up to February 2025) in the implementation of the Revitalized Agreement for the Resolution of Conflict in the Republic of South Sudan (R-ARCRSS).

The project results framework considers the overall UN strategy in South Sudan as represented in the UNSDCF (2023-2025), UN Women Strategic Note (2023-2025), and the UN Mission in South Sudan's mandate on the protection of civilians and peacekeeping. Consequently, the Resident Coordinator's strategic oversight prioritizes the project's objectives in emerging transition planning discussions and the development of integration mechanisms between peacebuilding, humanitarian, and development pillars. This action will support sustainability from the side of the UN and its presence in South Sudan.

This project is strategic to the context of South Sudan based on its contribution to political processes on elections and advocacy for gender-responsive systems on women leadership, political participation, and peacebuilding. UN Women and UNDP, and other agencies have ongoing and previous projects on women's political participation and leadership with support from the PBF, Norway and Sweden.

The launch, and future engagement by design, focused on strengthening stakeholders' accountability and cocreation for implementation. The Ministry of Peace Building (direct GoSS technical lead), Ministry of Gender, Child and Social Welfare, Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs, and women civil society groups will lead and support the project's management. This action is important to sustain peacebuilding and advocacy gains beyond the project's duration.

Are there any other issues concerning project implementation that you want to share, including any capacity needs of the recipient organizations?

UN Women and UNDP changed the institutions' funds management system from ATLA to Quantum in 2023 and still in progress migrating from ATLAs to Quantum. This situation affected implementation progress.
