Saferworld conducted partner contracting with Hope Restoration South Sudan (HRSS) and signed a memorandum of agreement with the partner during the reporting period. In addition, Saferworld conducted an organisational capacity assessment (OCA) to identify gaps for capacity strengthening. The identified capacity gaps were in safeguarding, financial management, and peacebuilding programming. To kick off the project, Saferworld and HRSS implemented inception activities, mostly meetings and a kick-off meeting to develop a detailed implementation work plan, assign roles and responsibilities, and specify how the partners would coordinate across states, as well as revisiting the selection criteria of WCSOs to receive core and flexible funding. Furthermore, Saferworld and its partners completed the project teams' staff recruitment. This period noted the initiation of a mapping exercise involving eight women civil society organisations (WSCO) across two conflict clusters: Central Equatoria, Eastern Equatoria, and Jonglei Conflict Cluster (including Torit, Nimule, Twic East, Bor, Kajo-Keji, and Yei) and Sobat Corridor Conflict Cluster (including Ulang, Nasir, Baliet, Malakal, Akobo, Nyirol, and Canal/Piji). The eight WCSOs will receive flexible and core financing to support their work on gender transformative peacebuilding, gender equality, and women, peace, and security advocacy. The scoping phase identified 12 WCSOs, and one-on-one discussions are ongoing to inform the final eight WCSOs.






