## Part C) Justification

Over the course of 21 months, the project has seen the completion of several key milestones, including the development of the Essential Migration Management and Joint Migration Development Initiatives training materials and Toolkits that was translated and contextualized for the Indonesian context. Furthermore, the partners have delivered capacity building and training on Essential Migration Management, joint migration development initiatives, applying Gender Responsive GCM Implementation and a rights-based survivor centred approach to front-liners for government and NGO stakeholders at national level and in the three target provinces of the project.

In addition to having reached the abovementioned milestones, the programme has encountered challenges since the beginning, resulting in a delay in achieving all intended outputs. As a snowball consequence of the delayed programme start date, IOM and the PUNOs had to spend additional time coordinating and reengaging with the programme partners and revising workplans. Although the Joint Programme started on 16 December 2021, implementation of the programme only started in September 2022, due to the long lead time in the programme's activation, because of the following:

- While the proposal was endorsed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA) due to it being the overall body working on the Global Compact for Migration there was a delay in identifying and securing the programme's overall lead ministry and focal point. This was because MoFA does not traditionally implement activities while this programme requires strong coordination, implementation, and reporting. Through this eight-month process, MoFA sought guidance from The Ministry of National Planning/BAPPENAS, the Ministry of Finance, and the State Secretariat on the best modality and arrangement for taking on this function. This was a learning opportunity for MoFA and all involved ministries on how to endorse and implement future cross-sectoral and joint programmes of a similar nature.
- Refocusing and realignment of the programmes activities with the government priorities
  resulting in back-and-forth coordination and amendments to the workplan, which was
  eventually endorsed on 25 November 2022 at the first PSC Meeting.
- Delays and changes to programme staffing which has created savings in personnel budget:
  - 1) IOM's National Programme Officer officially started in April 2022 while the Project Assistant started in September 2023 due to pending approval issue. It was decided to delay the



recruitment of the Project Assistant to reserve the personnel costs to enable the implementation of the remaining activities. To support this gap in staffing, IOM has benefitted from an international intern, sponsored by the China Scholarship Council from February 2023 through to the end of July 2023 and a national intern who joined IOM in June 2023.

- 2) UNDP's recruitment of its Technical Officer was delayed for 5 months from August to December 2022 as it was unable to reach gender parity in its shortlisted candidates. The Technical Officer commenced their duties in December 2022 while the Programme Specialist left the programme in May 2023 and the work was carried over to the Senior Technical Advisor.
- 3) UN Women did not have any staff leave the programme but had some delay in hiring its national consultant who came on board in July 2022.
- As a result of the modality agreed with MoFA, implementation of any activity requires an assigned government co-host to support coordination and oversee implementation of the activity. While this has encouraged and facilitated local ownership, buy-in and sustainability it has been onerous on the programme team as it often requires intensive coordination resulting in delays to implementation due to the need to adjust to government's competing priorities and availability to conduct the activities. Furthermore, the Government of Indonesia hosted the G20 Presidency in 2022 which was led and coordinated by MoFA which saw significant shifting of priorities and attention on the preparation and delivery of its G20 hosting obligations.

To this end and factoring in the upcoming 2024 Presidential Election which will also shift government's priorities and attention, the programme hereby requests your consideration and approval of a six month no-cost extension (NCE) of the project until 30 June 2024. Should the request be approved, this NCE will not modify the scope of the originally intended objectives. The following are the activities that will be carried out during the NCE period:
