SFCG engaged government authorities to get the official endorsement and permission to implement the project in collaboration with national partners. A Technical Agreement (TA) was signed between SFCG, Umserdiba Organization for Development, the Humanitarian Aid Commission (HAC) at the state level in South Kordofan, and The Ministry of Health and Social Development in South Kordofan. The TA signatures were initiated by the IP in March 2023, signed by SFCG in April 2023 after which the process was hindered due to the erupted conflict on the 15th of April, while it was resumed by the signature of the line ministry of september 25th, 2023 and it was signed by HAC state on October 1st, 2023.

Search started the Project by allocating internal staff, signing sub grants agreement with its partner in South Kordofan, signing a technical agreement with the Humanitarian Aid Commission at the state level (SK), and conducting the inception meeting with two of the project partners, Badya and Um Serdiba, and transferring the first tranche of funds to the former. The inception meeting with these two partners was held in Dilling, South Kordofan, during the last week of October 2023, and brought together Search staff, Badya, and Um Serdiba to discuss the project.

Search conducted a financial and programmatic capacity assessment for CAFA in Blue Nile, and unfortunately, CAFA didn't meet the necessary programmatic or financial standards to partner with Search on this project. As a result, Search proposed another partner to the PBF Secretariat in Sudan, Mubdeoon Organization for Development, Search's partner in Blue Nile for another project, which has displayed good financial and programmatic capacities. Search is also in discussions with Al Hareesat, whose team has fled to Uganda, but has been very active in supporting civil society women's engagement in the Sudanese peace process from there. SFCG is revising the contextual contribution of their scope of work to the project. SFCG is contacting the selected baseline consultant, Andariya Consultancy Group, to look at possibilities for collecting limited baseline data to inform the implementation of upcoming activities. Search is currently working on a proposed methodology, which we will be able to share with UNPBF in the coming month.

The progress in this outcome encountered some delays due to the outbreak of conflict on April 15, 2023. The overall insecurity and movement difficulties were a challenge affecting the safety of Search staff and other stakeholders who might be part of the activities. Some modifications were considered to overcome those challenges- e.g. the change in target localities in West Kordofan due to access issues.

Sustainability is an integral feature of the project's design. Platforms and activities established or supported under this project have included sustainability mechanisms and Search, alongside our local partners, will ensure our initiatives and platforms are connected to existing women's networks, and women's organisations so that they have continued support after the project ends. The online platforms, which are inexpensive for local groups to sustain with limited inputs, will continue to connect women leaders to one another to share information and resources beyond the project's end. Similarly, the Women's Centers will be handed over to local partners and existing women's networks for ongoing management and support. At the same time, Search will provide technical support to identify funding opportunities to sustain these centres.

The project focuses on strengthening the organisational capacity of WLWSOs and building relationships among diverse stakeholders which will contribute to the sustainability of project outcomes. By providing WLWSOs and women leaders with key skills in grants management, fundraising, grant writing, and coalition building the project team will be able to hand over key activities (such as the CSO networks) to strong organisations to continue to lead them. WLWSOs and women leaders will be supported to formalise their registration with local government entities so that they can continue to pursue funding opportunities. Lastly, sustainability has been included in the project's aim to shift social norms and perceptions: as relationships are built among diverse stakeholders, women's empowerment and women's rights will be recognized as a collective community priority rather than solely a women's issue. Further, the tangible results and benefits from the women-led peace and livelihood initiatives, promoted through the dialogues and multimedia campaign, will support a shift in social norms and contribute to increased and sustainable multi-stakeholder support for women's inclusion in recognition of the benefits of their inclusion and empowerment.

It is worth sharing that SFCG decided not to partner with CAFA in Blue Nile following a detailed capacity assessment of the organisation, and its staff/functioning as well as relationships with Blue Nile authorities in the current war situation. Instead, we would like to propose the Mubdeoon Organization for Development as a partner in Blue Nile, with whom we've conducted a more satisfactory capacity assessment and have been partnering over the past year, with satisfaction.

To avoid the accessibility restriction in Greater Lagawa locality in West Kordofan, Badya Center for Integrated Development (one of the project IPs) will cover Alsunoot, Alfula, and Abuzabd localities in West Kordofan state as part of the project target areas. This modification was approved by PBF secretariat and the partner's subaward agreement was modified accordingly.
