None during past 6 months. This is a result of the eruption of fighting between the Sudan Armed Forces (SAF) and the Rapid Support Forces (SAF) in Sudan starting in April 2023, which negatively affected the ability to implement humanitarian activities, and involved large-scale looting and attacks against humanitarian and government premises. The heavy fighting in Khartoum, the Darfur States and Northern Kordofan led to the forced displacement millions of people to neighbouring states in Sudan and also to surrounding countries, the breakdown of government structures. The latter led to the unavailability and of government focal points of this project, making it challenging to engage with them on project progress or planned activities. Furthermore, with the serious security situation, project staff themselves either relocated or were evacuated, resulting in limited physical presence and the disruption of communication, which in turn affected their ability to successfully work remotely further negatively affecting engagement with local authorities.

Outcome 1 of the project was a comprehensive data and analysis process which was intended to inform planning and interventions in key target areas across West, Central, and North Darfur. All data collection activities related to this outcome commenced in the first week of November 2022 and were completed by March 2023, prior to the start of the conflict in April 2023. In Darfur, data was collected by IOM Sudan's Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) team in coordination with Social Inquiry, while in Chad the data collection exercise was managed by UNHCR and its partner National Institute of Statistics, Economic and Demographic Studies (INSEED). The data collected was then cleaned and analysed by Social Inquiry to produce actionable findings in preparation for Outcome 2's community interventions. The workshops were due to take place in April 2023 but with many of the worst conflict hotspots situated across the Darfur region, these workshops are no longer possible in the target areas. Stakeholders cannot be gathered to attend community consultation workshops and UN staff are not permitted to work in those areas.

Social Inquiry and IOM Sudan are currently reviewing the analysis against current conflict dynamics and intend to prepare a number of thematic briefs to be issued before the end of the year. These thematic briefs will provide information on the data collection's findings that may still prove useful to future peacebuilding and humanitarian activities despite the dramatic changes to the Darfur context. These include themes around peacebuilding needs, historical inter-communal tensions and grievances, and traditional nomadic and other movements, the situation prior to the conflict and the potential impact of the current conflict on them.

The sampling strategy for data collection included quotas for gender and age so data incorporates the views of both women and youth. The questionnaire included gender issues as potential responses to some questions (for example, with regards to incidence of violence and reasons for marginalization). Due to the quotas incorporated in the sampling strategy, the project team can identify insights that correlate to certain gender or age groups, which will be incorporated into the thematic briefs mentioned above.

The conflict in Sudan commencing mid-April 2023 erupted prior to the implementation of planned stakeholder consultation workshops across West, Central, and North Darfur. These consultation workshops were intended to contextualise the data collected earlier during the reporting period and provide useful inputs for planned activities under outcome 2 including (1) the generation of materials relating to the project's objectives and (2) community support interventions. However, this is no longer possible due to the insecurity in the region, the significant change in the region's conflict
and peacebuilding dynamics in comparison to the pre-conflict context, mass forced displacement internally and to neighbouring Chad, and the conflict's impact on the participation of local stakeholders. Consultations between IOM and UNHCR are continuing to gauge how planned community support interventions can still be coordinated under the current circumstances, including potential reprogramming in other areas of Sudan.

Thes include the development of relevant policies and interventions which support the peace process and enable the voluntary, safe, sustainable and peaceful return and (re)integration of displaced populations. With the start of the conflict mid-April 2023, non-critical activities have been suspended.
