The project team initiated preparatory planning, developed terms of reference for the Baseline Survey, and conducted inception consultative meetings with diverse stakeholders, including civil society actors and media, as well as central and local authorities. Preliminary agreements were reached with the Ministry of Culture to redefine Public Consultative Councils (PCCs) by strengthening governance and partnership arrangements. The project started the selection process for conducting the baseline survey to measure public trust and identify common problems in target geographic locations, guiding project interventions. Research was initiated to analyze hate speech and information pollution, with recommendations for response measures and media and information literacy programs. The project established cooperation with the Ministry of Education and Science and Kyrgyzstan's media community, including the Association of Community Media, Public Association Union of Communicators of Kyrgyzstan, Media Consulting Development Foundation in Central Asia, and the Media Policy Institute. Preliminary mapping of media, civil society, and grassroots organizations was conducted at the seven target communities to facilitate active community engagement with a bottom-up approach, resulting in the creation of a database of local active groups to support the rebuilding of PCCs.

Regarding staff recruitment, the Project Associate on Peacebuilding and UNESCO National Associated Project Officer have been hired, UNDP ongoing process of CSO project coordinator recruitment. The Joint-Steering Committee as well as technical meetings with national partners (state authorities and local CSOs) were held to engage them into design of project activities.

To better understand the existing needs of PRCs, the conflict situation and risks, consultative meetings held with participation of PRCs, civil society, local authorities.. The consultative meetings shaded light on the specific dynamics of the conflicts in pilots, providing insights into the potential triggers, and vulnerabilities that need to be addressed. Attitudes and trends vary widely, but there's a growing trend toward resources disputes, and addressing water, land conflicts. These disputes can arise from a variety of factors and can take many forms. It is crucial for communities to address these issues through fair and sustainable land management, transparent policies, and equitable dispute resolution mechanisms to promote peace and stability. The project is actively engaged in providing technical support and expertise to the Ministry of Culture for the review and validation of the National Peacebuilding Action Plan. The project facilitated a series of national consultations. During the consultative meetings, it became evident that the current system for implementing, monitoring, and evaluating existing action plans with a focus on social cohesion is not well-established. Multiple overlapping, overly ambitious, and inadequately measurable measures often result delay in implementation. Additionally, the executors face challenges due to their workload from other tasks and assignments.

The RUNOs conducted an analysis of current hate speech and information pollution, yielding an analytical framework. Recommendations encompass harmonizing national legislation with international standards and enhancing content moderation and capacity building by the project.

Utilizing a multi-stakeholder approach, project engaged the expertise of diverse organizations CSOs, State and Academia on data sharing and getting grass root recommendations on freedom of expression, internet universality and R.O.A.M. principles, to prepare ground for the collaboration withing the scope of project.

The aim of multistakeholder advisory board for global Internet governance framework is to promote data-based policies in access to information, safety of journalists, quality reporting and access citizens to media which will be local baseline, complements for coming interventions to strengthen social cohesion.

Project mainstream gender sensitivity and equality across all programming steps. In order to design National Peacebuilding Action Plan in a gender-responsive way, the NAP 1325 was integrated, by including the subsection 3.3 – "Involvement of women and strengthening their role in the preservation of peace, security and prevention of gender-based violence". This helped to include activities involving women and youth participation in National Peacebuilding Action Plan and avoid lack of their representation in conflict management mechanisms.. For instance, the plan includes training for local community leaders on the topic: "Empowering women and girls and their active participation in peace-building and inclusive development processes." In addition, enhancing the capacity of government agencies in issues related to the Women, Peace, Security agenda, prevention and response to gender-based violence in emergency situations and other crisis situations. Furthermore, one of the activities is integration into the curriculum of the Academy of the Ministry of Internal Affairs and AGUPKR an educational program with focus on studying best practices in providing assistance to victims of family and other types of gender-based violence.
