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Description	<p>This Joint Project by UNDP, UNHCR, IOM, and FAO (the PUNOs) will support the Government of Yemen’s national authorities (the Executive Unit for IDPs) and local authorities to design and implement gender and conflict-sensitive area-based, development-oriented durable solutions to displacement by inducing systemic change through 1. Developing joint assessments of the situations, needs, and solutions preferred by IDPs and host communities, while building the capacity of local Government to shape evidence-based innovative investment and to measure progress; 2. Supporting national and local authorities' efforts to facilitate the integration of IDPs through integrated policy innovation, legal reform, and institutional change; and 3. Testing innovative measures to amplify locally tailored, community-led, needs-based development solutions in pilot locations in Aden, Marib, Taiz, and Lahj, drawing lessons for eventual scaling up.</p> <p>The activities are closely interconnected: The joint integrated assessments will serve as baselines to understand the intentions and needs of IDPs, particularly conflict-affected women and children, host communities, and local authorities, as well as the underlying socio-economic and security-related causes of displacements and the potential for successful integration. The process of developing them will provide hands-on capacity-building to national and local authorities on data collection, analysis, and use towards developing locally tailored, gender and conflict-sensitive, needs-based, durable, and development-oriented solutions initiatives with the affected communities. Robust capacity-building activities will support the Executive Unit for IDP Camp Management (ExU) at the national level and local authorities at the governorate level in programming for durable solutions. The joint work will feed into the development of an action plan at the national level for the 2013 National Policy for Addressing Internal Displacement in the Republic of Yemen.</p> <p>The PUNOs will work with IDPs and host communities, national and local authorities in using the findings from the joint assessments to develop localized area-based Durable Solutions Plans of Action (PoAs) in line with the framework of the Durable Solutions Framework prepared by the Durable Solutions Working Group in support of the 2013 National Policy and aligned with global IASC standards on durable solutions. The framework and these activities emphasize non-discrimination, human rights, the meaningful participation of IDPs in decision-making, and the cooperation between Government, humanitarian, development, and peacebuilding actors to ensure a more government-owned, development-driven approach to displacement solutions across the Humanitarian-Development-Peace Nexus (HDPN). Gender and conflict-sensitive programming components between PUNOs in the Durable Solutions PoAs under Output 3 will include livelihoods, gender, good governance, protection, documentation, basic services, housing, and social cohesion activities. The PoAs under Output 3 will be closely linked to the eight Specific Objectives of the Durable Solutions Working Group Strategic and Operational Framework.</p> <p>To ensure the catalytic impact of its work, activities were coordinated and aligned with the 2023 Humanitarian Response Plan and will transfer successful approaches to the 2022-2024 UNDCF, which aims to address the development needs of Yemen. This will ensure other sources of support are leveraged towards SDG acceleration.</p>





