| | The Fund Secretariat supported the Fund's governance structures and effectively acted as liaison between the Secretary General's Designate and the Fund's Advisory Committee (AC) by facilitating regular meetings and updates to AC members as well as follow-up and implementation of meeting action points. Further, the Secretariat assisted UN Country Teams to understand and adhere to the requirements of the Fund's Administrative Agent and promoted the UN Resident Coordinator role within UN Country Teams to support UN coherence and ensure a unified system response. |
| | Output 2: Facilitating the achievement of the Results Framework through results- based management and reporting |
| | The Secretariat supported the achievement of the Results Framework of the Fund, results-based monitoring and reporting with regular progress reports throughout project cycles. The secretariat delivered consolidated narrative interim, annual and final reports to monitor overall progress across the Pillars of the SG's Framework for Socioeconomical Response. For each reporting cycle, the Fund Secretariat produced individual country briefs to track results from all the Fund's active projects. |

| | The secretariat ensured transparency and posted all project materials online on the Multi- Partner Trust Fund office Gateway platform. Furthermore, the Secretariat |

helped channel funds for an <u>Early Lessons and Evaluability of the UN COVID-19</u> <u>Response and Recovery MPTF</u> as well as a <u>System Wide Evaluation of UNDS Socio-Economic Response to COVID-19 report</u>. The findings from the two reports were featured in the Fund's Final Narrative Report, which highlighted key lessons and good practices.

Output 3. The programme cycle effectively managed

The Secretariat effectively managed the programme cycle and facilitated a Call for Proposals as well as a Call for Concept Notes within the first 8 months of the Fund's existence and vetted proposals and concepts for funding. With approval from the SGs Designate and endorsement by the Advisory Committee, the Fund Secretariat allocated 83.6 million to 97 programmes in 84 countries and built a project pipeline of 204 readily implementable projects. The Fund Secretariat collaborated with the Secretariat of the Joint SDG Fund Secretariat to ensure handover lessons and help with the establishment of a Development Emergency Modality based on the COVID-19 Response and Recovery Fund modality for emergency response.

Output 4: Support to outreach

The secretariat facilitated the "Recover Better Together" Action Forum on 26 June 2020, which helped catalyze the partnerships and finance the Fund's needs to make lasting change. The Secretariat also launched the "Making a Difference" Twitter campaign. The campagin featured Tweets displaying impact stories and pictures and was created in cooperation with RC Offices, which promoted the campaign to UN Agencies and donors through one-UN Twitter accounts. The campaign ran through November-December 2020 and again through May-June 2021 and generated over 320,000 user interactions.

The Secretariat facilitated individual meetings between the SG's Designate and potential donors from governments and private sector and communication with country offices to facilitate earmarked contributions and contributions from other UN entities and ensure compliance with administrative procedures. All of which added to the total sum of donor contributions of 86.3 million funding to the improvement of the overall results of the Fund.

| (include information on delays and programme/ budget revisions and account for changes to the | The First extension was granted to extend the project end date from 30 June 2022 to 31 December 2022 and increase the Secretariat Project with USD 243,805. This was done partly to absorb new donor contributions, which were used to fund three projects from the Fund's pipeline and partly to accommodate a high number of no-cost extension request from UN Country Teams, which were faced with challenges to adapt to continued COVID-19 restriction measures. The extension was proposed at the Fund's 24 th Advisory Committee in November 2021 and was supported by committee members. |
| original workplan): | The second cost extension changed the projects end date from 31 December 2022 to 31 March 2023 with a budget increase of USD 127,597. The second extension was made to allow for proper communication with donors and orderly handover of documentation after the Fund has closed, as well as respond to any follow-up inquiries on the global narrative compilation report. Furthermore, the extension allowed the Secretariat to support the SG's Designate to reach out to the Fund's Advisory Committee members and provide information on options for any remaining balance after Fund closure. |
