As a grants manager, NORCAP's main responsibility will be to manage small grants and contracts to ecosystem partners who will be entrusted with implementing the chosen activities. Executive Summary	<p>This project aims to strengthen the CRAF'd ecosystem that enhances crisis response in crisis-affected and fragile settings to reach people earlier, faster and in a more targeted and dignified way. Currently, a fragmented data landscape, siloed work, and lack of coordination in investment and capacity pose challenges to impactful crisis action. By building connections between different stakeholders and coordinating efforts and investments, the project seeks to address these challenges and promote collaboration among actors. The expected outcomes of the project include deeper knowledge, increased sustainability, improved applicability, greater diversity of perspectives, and a more strategic approach to data-driven anticipation, prevention, and response to complex risks.</p> <p>By strengthening a scalable, sustainable, and well-governed CRAF'd data ecosystem, the project will create synergies and bring data-driven approaches to scale, enhancing the effectiveness of international crisis response. Ultimately, the project aims to drive greater resilience and stronger support to people and the planet in pursuit of the Agenda 2030.</p> <p>In this project, NORCAP will play a crucial role as a small grants manager to support the implementation of CRAF'd ecosystem activities. As a grant manager, NORCAP's main responsibility will be to manage small grants and contracts to ecosystem partners who will be entrusted with implementing the chosen activities. In doing so, NORCAP will work closely with CRAF'd and stakeholders to enable conferences and events aimed at providing capacity building, conducting research and analysis, and supporting the development of local data ecosystems and communities of practice for data-driven crisis action.</p> <p>NORCAP, as part of the NRC, has a strategic objective to improve the effectiveness of multilateral institutions and responses, with a specific focus on enabling multilateral institutions and national actors to use data and new technologies for evidence-based decision making. Background and General Relevance	<p>The current state of data-driven crisis response is fraught with challenges, including a lack of coordination and collaboration among stakeholders, a fragmented data landscape, and a shortage of high-quality data, knowledge, and capacity to respond to crises. These issues, compounded by insufficient insights into complex risks, have led to negative outcomes for affected populations and hindered effective decision-making.</p> <p>In response to these challenges, the proposed project aims to strengthen a scalable, sustainable, and well-governed ecosystem that fosters synergies and brings data-driven approaches to scale. By building connections between different stakeholders and coordinating efforts and investments, the project seeks to ensure that data and analytics enable better insights into complex risks in crisis-affected and fragile settings.</p> <p>This approach will enhance evidence-based decision- and policy-making, including resource allocation decisions by major multilateral financing instruments, and guide operational planning and programming processes. As such, the project's overarching goal is to drive greater resilience and stronger support for people and planet in pursuit of Agenda 2030.</p> <p>To achieve this goal, the project will support CRAF'd efforts through managing funds to enable a range of activities, including convening conferences, events, and workshops to link up data providers, practitioners, policy experts. Additionally, the project will provide capacity building, conduct research and analysis, and support the development of local data ecosystems and communities of practice. By taking these steps, the project aims to promote collaboration and create synergies among CRAF'd ecosystem partners and bring data-driven approaches to scale.</p>

Scalability	<p>Whenever possible, we will encourage project partners to collaborate with existing networks, including (local) civil society organizations, academia, and private sector actors, to create synergies and scale up effects. By leveraging existing CRAFT and NORCAP partner networks, the project can tap into broad partnership network and expertise, build on existing capacities, and reduce duplication of efforts.</p>
Innovation	<p>By bringing together data providers, practitioners, policy experts from across the humanitarian, peace and development sectors, the project can create a space for cross-sectoral collaboration and learning, which can lead to innovative approaches to data collection, management, and use in crisis-affected and fragile settings. This collaboration can also promote the use of new and innovative technologies for data collection, analysis, and visualization, such as using mobile devices, remote sensing, and artificial intelligence.</p>
Cost Effectiveness	<p>The project has been designed with a lean administrative structure to reduce overhead costs. To efficiently allocate funds for ecosystem activities, small grants will be provided to project partners with low transaction costs. We will encourage co-funding to lessen the financial burden. To achieve this, partnering with different organizations and institutions to leverage networks and resources will be explored to share costs. With multiple funding sources, the project can also ensure its sustainability beyond the funding period.</p>
