The project has made significant progress from inception stages to date and has successfully recruited qualified and skillful staff members to fill out essential roles. The Identification and selection of the implementing partners /CSOs has also been completed, culminating into development of detailed work plan for each of these organizations. There are specific tasks outlined in these various work plans with timelines and budgets which have since been approved and signed. Currently, the project is at its implementation phase with the Capacity-building sessions taken off earnestly based on the identified gaps during the conducted assessment of these organizations. Overall, the solid foundation has been laid for the successful implementation of the project and the actualization of the Project goal of networking, building synergies and forming a coalition for a common goal.

The progress made and the results achieved during the project's implementation from January to June was a follow up of the Capacity Assessment and Gap Identification, In October/November 2023, comprehensive capacity assessments were conducted for all 23 Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), including umbrella CSOs. The consultant identified areas where capacity building is needed. This assessment served as the foundation for targeted interventions to address gaps in management, financial practices, and programmatic effectiveness. Collaborative Training Approach adopted by involving umbrella CSOs, who jointly planned and shared training responsibilities. Each of the three umbrella organizations focused on specific areas, ensuring that planning, budgeting and support were aligned with the needs of the CSOs under their supervision. The GPI 2.0 Secretariat played a crucial role in supporting umbrella organizations and their affiliated CSOs. Where gaps existed in management, finance, or program implementation, the Secretariat provided guidance and assistance. Work Plans and budgets were made jointly while focusing on specific need gaps. In the period under review, a Terms of Reference (ToR) was developed for a Finance Consultant. The role was to enhance financial literacy and ensure quality accountability within the CSOs. The goal was to minimize errors, install financial software and improve financial practices for better project results. All this collaborative effort and targeted capacity building are driving the project toward success. Even though the implementation has just taken off, the capacity built from the assessment period to date by the project has started yielding result as evidenced in the active participation of these organization in creating civic space for critical engagement with the lawmakers and the government of the Gambia in the ongoing debate on FGM Law that is been threatened by a group of people who want the law repealed. This strategic engagement aimed at protecting the rights of women and girls and preventing Gender based violence in the country is an encouragement and assurance that the GPI Project is apt and has come at the right time.

To ensure youth inclusion and responsiveness in Gender equality and women empowerment, the project has enlisted eight (08) youth groups (Sankiwa Integrated Young Association, Young Advocates for SSHSR Gambia, Youth Power Network International, Sandu Youth, Basse Got a Talent, Kombo Youth, Raise the young Foundation, National Youth Parliament) which represents 34.8 % of the implementing CSOs. Currently, the capacity of these Youthfocused CSO is being built and they will be supported by the GPI Project Technical team as well as through Peer-Mentorship Approach which is another Phase and strategy in the implementation of GPI Project. The technical support will include (but not limited) strengthening the operational and institutional capacity of these youth-led organizations as well as the others who are women-led and women-focused civil society organizations (CSOs), including Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) addressing women related concerns for optimization in Gender equality and women empowerment programming. The Project will achieve this through supporting the implementation of the Gambia National Action Plan for UNSCR 1325, as well as GEWE-related elements of the TRRC White Paper recommendations. other areas of utmost importance where capacity will be built are in the protection of the rights of women and girls in situations of conflict and in peace support operations; participation of women in conflict prevention and resolution, peace and security institutions and processes; and prevention of violence against women and girls including sexual gender-based and conflict related violence.

The project's strategies and initiatives were developed to support the implementation the Gambia National Action Plan UNSCR 1325 and the TRRC White Paper GEWE Recommendations for the greater participation, protection, and representation of women in decision making processes within governance institutions and within national, regional and community level conflict prevention, management, and resolution mechanisms.

Innovative ways of Working: Previously before the GPI 2.0, many Civil Society Organizations (CSOs)in the Gambia operated independently, leading to inefficiencies and duplicated efforts. However, now the civic society -CSOs collaborate, coordinate, and streamline their activities, resulting in better outcomes. The implementation of the GPI 2.0 project represents a critical milestone because it aims to empower women-led and women-focused civil society organisations (CSOs) in The Gambia. The project's goal aligns with the 2021-2025 National Action Plan on UNSCR 1325, focusing on gender equality, women's empowerment, peace, and security. Through continued collaboration with the government and civil society in The Gambia, the project enhances institutional capacity, particularly among local organisations in rural areas, addressing TRRC Recommendations. The GPI 2.0 project involves twenty-three (23) CSOs, carefully selected from a pool of 43 applicants under the United Nations Peacebuilding Fund (PBF). The selection process was merit-based, considering outstanding performance and strength.

During the inception meeting, clear objectives were outlined to facilitate sustained interaction and meaningful exchanges. These objectives align with learning goals, emphasising capacity building, organisational unity, effective collaboration, and addressing emerging issues collectively. Reporting requirements and organisational partnerships are also crucial aspects of the project's success.

All the civic spaces are now stronger together with one voice. The Umbrella CSOs now work directly and jointly with the CBOs to reach local/grass roots with their implementation strategies. All is to have a strengthened CSO to promote gender equality and women's empowerment through implementation of the Action Plan on UNSCR 1325 and the TRRC White Paper Recommendations.

As women, Youth focused and led CSOs, at the community level in the three project regions, the partners with the sub-contractors will foster Human Development, Social Inclusion, and People-Centred Governance through robust policy advocacy for Gender Equality. More emphasis will be on strengthening mechanisms, institutional capacities, and policies which aim to advocate for gender equality and enhance women's participation in politics and leadership. Evidence-based decision to address all forms of discrimination, SGBV, and promote economic empowerment of women and those living with disability. The gender and children's unit of security agencies will collaborate to carry out joint operations to address SGBV and enhance their capacity in SGBV. The capacity of women with disabilities will be enhanced and their livelihoods will be advanced with support programs. Database of donors and CSOs working in peacebuilding will be developed and create synergy among them.

The initiative aims to enhance the institutional capacity of the CBOs through improved coordination and aligned capacity building at the grassroot level. TANGO and the subcontractors will support gender promotion efforts and projects through the CSOs and CBOs in the Gambia to advance gender equality. These partners focus on reinforcing the existing capacity of CSOs in Monitoring, Evaluation, and Reporting, GTA, Gender Mainstreaming and Budgeting, Resource Mobilization, and Strategic Development among other trainings. Essential tools will be provided, to foster GEWE within communities; and establish CSO houses in the project's target regions to facilitate the expansion of civic space and development of a comprehensive CSO database for both CSOs and donors to enable alignment to intervention areas and priorities.

ActionAid International, will continue to create a well coordinated civic space in and focus on training civil society organizations and community stakeholders on governance, human rights-based programming, advocacy, and resource mobilization to equip the CSOs and CBOS with the necessary tools that will foster gender equality and women empowerment within the community. Action-Aid International will leverage on her past experiences in community engagement to create civic space in advocating for GEWE, and women's political participation and leadership, advocating for a reformed legislative engagement at the community level.

NGBV will addresses GBV issues, strengthen the capacity of CBOs institutionally, and increase their capacity to promote GEWE. The activities will advocate for and deliver evidence-based program targeting marginalized women and girls, including those at risk of FGM, child marriage and gender-based violence, thus sustaining efforts made in public awareness on the legislation prohibiting FGM/C. NGBV in collaboration with the Ministry of Gender will provide high quality SRH and GBV integrated GBV response services to survivors at the just established one-stop center's

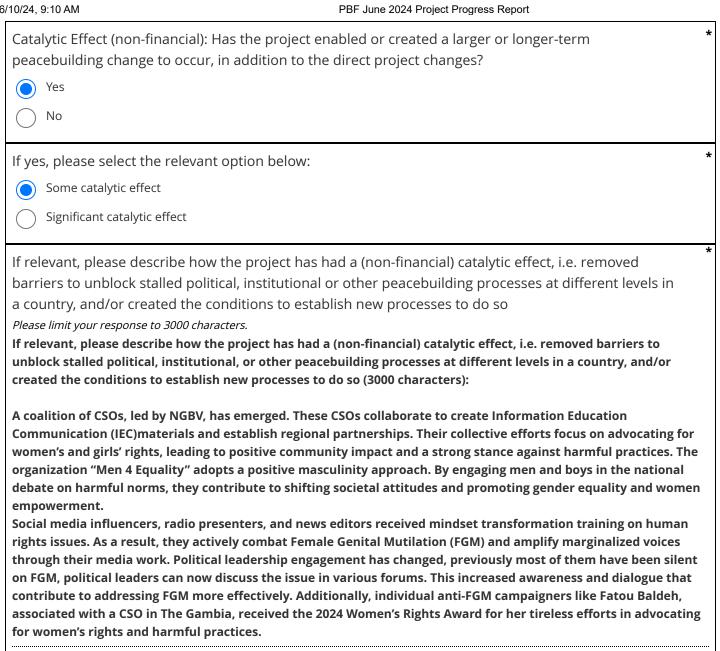
