Over the last six months the project engaged with HAC at the state level and localities directors in the conducted trainings which targeted community leaders, sheikhs, sultans and key staff of local government authorities on gender equality, gender discriminatory norms, GBV to raise their awareness to become proactive duty-bearers. In this regard the project team has facilitated five workshops which discussed the above topics at the target localities levels namely Suakin, Toker, Port Sudan, Sinkat and Haya. The state HAC Commissioner and Minister of Social Affairs attended the final day of trainings and reassured their support to the objectives of the project and the significant role played by PBF and SOS Sahel Sudan organization. Likewise, the Minister of Production and Economic resources and locality executive director appreciated the project intervention. Also, both the social development minister (who chaired the meetings) and HAC commissioner have participated actively in the project steering committee meetings.

The project team held several meetings with a representative of the Youth Department and Head of cultural associations and sportive clubs. The meeting agenda discussed the ways of collaboration between the project and the department of youth and concluded to jointly conduct youth activities.

The project collaborated with Red Sea University where consultants from the university facilitated the gender workshops. Also, the project coordinated with Quran university for providing training venues and services.

The project team developed and prepared a draft TOR for Baseline Survey and shared it with PBF secretariat for comments and approval. The PBF made its inputs and accordingly the project team incorporated the PBF comments for the finalization of the TOR. Then the Project Management immediately invited consultants to express their interest to conduct the survey. 3 consultants have expressed their interest and but only two submitted technical proposals. The project team selected the most relevant one to conduct the baseline study. Contract was signed with a consultant, and he started collecting the baseline data on 4th June.

The beneficiaries' identification is going on process, however the 25 CSOs have been selected for TOT training including ten women-led CSOs and the other youth based CSOs. The key local authority staff, community leaders, and native administration have been identified as project beneficiaries and accordingly they were trained in different topics such as accountability civic rights, young men and women rights.

During this reporting period the project, in collaboration with hired consultants conducted TOT workshops for 30 young men and women CSOs. The workshops covered the following topics:

• Conflict Analysis, Conflict Transformation and Social Peace in Diverse Context. From 24th up to 26th December 2023.

• Advocacy and Communication for Social Peace and Democracy. From 30 December 2023 – 1 January 2024 • Leadership, Facilitation & Networking Skills. From 2-4 January 2024.

• Gender equality, gender discriminatory norms &GBV, attended by (30) participants representing young men &women CSOs 13 male & 18 females, from 23rd -25th January 2024.

• Pre and post-tests scoring of the above trainings respectively as follows:

□ 38% - 79.8%

□ 32.7% - 71.9

□ 40.7% - 82.9%

□ 38.7% - 81.2%

Moreover, the project implementing team in collaboration with hired consultant conducted three days Training of Trainers (ToT) workshops for young trainers in: Elections and Electoral Processes, starting from 20th -22nd January 2024. The workshop took place in EL-Quran EL-Kareem University Hall. Attended by (30) participants representing young men and women CSOs, 18 out of 30 where female participants represent more than 50% to assure gender sensitive approach in all implemented project activities.

The objective of these trainings is to improve the capacity of trainees and equip them with the necessarily skills so that they can pass the knowledge they gain from the training to their peers at the project target area. The TOT trainings' participants will be formed into two teams of facilitators one for the civic education and the other for peace building to conduct outreach plans at localities level.

In collaboration with Red Sea University the project has conducted a number of workshops and training sessions as follows:

• Two Orientation trainings on action planning, prioritization techniques, teamwork, work plan monitoring, how to organize training workshops, and reporting, attended by 30 participants representing CSOs starting from 3rd -8th February 2024. The total female participated in this training is 19 women.

• Workshops for young women CSOs in: Social Exclusion Analysis. Attended by 30 female participants representing young women CSOs from target localities the objective of the training is to analyse causes of social exclusion and elements that lead to social exclusion, as well the harms that it may affect at the level of individuals and the community. The workshops were conducted during the period from 9th -11th January 2024.

A training for women-CSOs in Gender-Based Violence (GBV), women rights and the UN Security Council Resolution 1325 on women and peace and security. Attended by 30 female participants representing young women CSOs from target localities. The training run during the period from 6th -8th January 2024.

Moreover, the project focused on engagement with the local authorities of the target localities, where all target localities staff received training session on different topics.

Sessions were conducted in collaboration with Red Sea University for conducting 5 trainings of duty-bearers at state and locality level on accountability, civic rights, political participation and young men and women rights. The total participants of sessions were 127 participants including 60females. The training workshops took place at the target localities premises.

Furthermore, the project has sponsored a program of social media platform is called Elbejawi Intentional channel. It was established by young digital creator called Adam who leads a team of young talented person who are Social Media activists. The channel programs are posted on different social media platforms such as Facebook, YouTube and TikTok. The platform is broadcasting different topics in social peace, culture, sports and politics. The platform has a program that reflects social issues and suggests solutions through carefully selected guests who can contribute to reforming social fabrics that has been affected by the recent conflict of ethnic groups. The Program show is moreover aiming to encourage peaceful coexistence.

The project has contracted Elbejawi platform to execute six episodes through interviewing most influential persons from the ethnic groups with experience of conflict the ethnic conflict which had happened before the current crisis of Sudan. During the broadcasting the channel has interviewed more than twelve persons representing different ethnic groups mainly Beja, Nuba and Beni Aamer who used to conflict on power representation at the national level The episodes focused on the root causes of tribal conflict and ways and plans to avoid that in future. The guests are community activists, tribal leaders, and native administration. The episodes are already posted on Facebook, YouTube and TikTok, the total views so far nearly 200,000 viewers for 6 episodes.

For all activities of the project so far implemented, particularly the capacity building trainings, the project team made sure that the women as represented as the men. 19 out of 30 participants were female of all TOT trainings Ten women led CSOs exclusively were trained in gender-based violence and social exclusion.

The project through training sessions has created space of dialogue and conversation among groups of young men and women to discuss their issues openly and freely.

The project has brought together under one roof members of ethnic groups who used to fight each other's conflict but now jointly are discussing youth related agenda and as well discussing ways to avoid future conflict. The project activities linked the youth to local authorities where now coordination started between the youth and the local authorities. For this phase it is informal coordination, but it is planned to form a coordination committee at the locality level.

The project offered space for women to speak their minds now at least at training venues and consultation meetings at the field level.
