Preparatory activities were completed, including the annual work plan, M&E plan, and Risk log for year one (2024). Programme coordination commenced at different levels including coordination meetings amongst recipient UN agencies and the direct recipient CSO partner and progress review meetings with implementing partners. Participating UN agencies also participated in the monthly land development partners' meetings convened by the Liberia Land Authority (LLA) to strengthen coordination of land governance initiatives with other development partners including the World Bank, European Union, Action Aid, Swedish Lantmäteriet, USAID, and CSOs working in the land sector. Periodic ad hoc meetings were also held with government partners including the LLA, Peace Building Office (PBO) under the Ministry of Internal Affairs, National Bureau of Concessions (NBC), and the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to further discuss support needs from partners and progress made. In addition, the recipient agencies have finalized staff recruitment and the recruitment of all Implementing Partners (IPs) including Civil Society Organizations (CSOs). A joint assessment was conducted by implementing agencies and government partners to all project counties. It provided the platform for the project to be introduced to all local stakeholders in the counties.

#### Project progress summary

The implementation of the joint project is on track with significant efforts made towards the achievement of the overall project goal, supporting the implementation of the Land Rights Act (LRA) and Local Government Act (LGA) to empower rural communities including women and youth to manage their land and contribute to land conflict resolution. Towards this end, capacities of land governance institutions at national and local levels are being enhanced by acquiring critical work equipment and training. Awareness of women's rights to land ownership and participation in land discussions and decision-making including dispute resolution and participating in community leadership processes are ongoing. 785 community members (338 females and 447 males, 27% of whom are youth) from Grand Gedeh and Gbapolu counties have enhanced awareness of the Land Rights Act (LRA), existing concession agreements, and their role and have strengthened understanding of the rights of women, communities, and youth to land.

The project completed mapping and assessing the gender sensitiveness of semi-formal and formal land dispute resolution bodies and land governance structures in the new project counties of Grand Gedeh, Bomi, and Gbarpolu establishing the need for gender mainstreaming in the existing ones and the establishment of additional structures in these counties. This is important to ensure enhanced capacities of communities to use alternative dispute resolution processes and engage women actively in these processes. In addition, 175 (100 men and 75 women) members of the Community Land Development and Management Committees (CLDMCs), community leaders, local government officials, CSOs/CBOs, youths, and women from seventeen (17) of the project communities in Grand Cape Mount, Bomi, Nimba, and Gbarpolu Counties enhanced their knowledge on the various steps required in the land formalization process as stipulated in the Community Self-identification (CSI) guide; boundary harmonization and confirmatory survey process; women's land rights in the context of customary land formalization; alternative dispute resolution processes and the role of women as members of ADR mechanisms.

The production of visibility items, including t-shirts, flyers, posters, and billboards, has been completed. These promotional materials have simple messages that convey information on women's land rights, including policies and laws, to increase citizens' knowledge about customary land rights and policies.

Procurement of agriculture tools and equipment such as power tillers, rice mills, de-stumpers, and cassava processors for rural women farmers is completed. These pieces of equipment will enhance the productivity of rural women farmers in affected counties through climate-smart agriculture best practices. In addition, livelihood assessments were completed in 20 selected communities of the project counties. These assessments gathered important data/information that will inform the type and scale of livelihood interventions to be carried out.

Established community land governance structures such as CLDMCs are mechanisms that ensure women's engagement and active participation. Leadership roles in these structures constitute 50 percent of women and men equally. This means men and women have equal responsibilities in decision-making over land matters. The youth (males and females) are actively engaged in the interventions with at least 30 percent of all persons reached to date being young people between 18-35 years old. The youth actively participate and act as community facilitators during town hall meetings and awareness sessions. Women, men, and youth are involved in alternative dispute resolution processes, livelihood interventions, and community mapping processes. The project is empowering women's structures such as the women's peace huts to support their actions as agents of change in their role in peacebuilding and conflict resolution.
