The project engaged with governments in Cameroon, Chad, Niger and Nigeria,

The project successfully engaged with the governor's offices in the Far North and North regions of Cameroon. Following the presentation of the PBF project, the governors communicated their support and formally validated the project's work plans. This project aims to promote peace-building initiatives by CSOs in the Lake Chad Basin, particularly in the Far North and North regions. A formal letter of validation was signed to endorse the project-identified activities.

In Chad, it liaised with the governor's offices in Lac and Hadjer Lamis provinces, validating work plans and terms for engaging CSOs. The project communicated its objectives to the Far North and North Cameroon governors in Cameroon, receiving formal validation for its work plans. During the national meeting of the RSF-Chad window, the project was presented under the overall PBF RSF-Chad window.

In Nigeria, the project interfaced with focal points in Borno, Adamawa, and Yobe states and engaged with the Northeast Development Commission, the national body overseeing peacebuilding development initiatives in the project regions. As a result, the respective annual work plan, terms of reference for selecting CSOs, and the terms of reference of the national technical committee were developed and validated during these engagements. In Niger, the CSO-led project aligns with the governance of the country-wide PBF-funded project within the framework of the regional Stabilization Facility of the Lake Chad Basin Region. It maintained regular exchanges with the Governor of the Diffa region and the regional Council, initiating a high-level political dialogue to maintain communication with the newly established authorities following the country's change of government in 2023. The project aims to promote peace-building initiatives by CSOs in the Lake Chad Basin Region.

Overall, the project's engagements with the national and regional governments in Chad, Cameroon, Nigeria, and Niger have been instrumental in securing validation and support for the project's objectives and implementation plans. These collaborations ensure that the project activities align with local governance structures and priorities, setting the stage for effective implementation and achieving the desired outcomes.

Since the beginning of the project, several preliminary/preparatory activities have been sustained with significant progress. The UNDP has appointed national project officers/focal points in all four countries on a 50% cost share basis and has appointed an acting Programme Manager and an Administration and Finance Officer to oversee implementation until the regional recruitment is finalized. Five project planning coordination meetings with representatives from all four countries were held. These meetings helped develop and validate the project's Annual Work Plans (AWPs), the terms of reference for the call for proposal/expression of interest for CSO selection, formalizing the national technical committee, establishing reporting requirements, and familiarizing stakeholders with the project implementation arrangement.

In collaboration with the regional governor's offices and PBF officers at the RCO's office, the AWPs were reviewed, validated, and consolidated for Steering Committee approval. In addition, dedicated planning and coordination meetings were conducted with all partners across the four countries and with UNDP regional and country offices, PBF, LCBC Secretariat, and the RCO to ensure a shared understanding of roles and responsibilities and enhance collaboration. The budget for each country has been reviewed and set up in the UNDP ERP Quantum system. The process for selecting beneficiaries and implementation partners has been initiated with an approved call for proposals launched in two countries of Cameroon and Niger. Consequently, four (4) civil society organizations were selected in Cameroon, contracts were signed, and funds were disbursed to their respective bank accounts.

At the national level, the preparatory phase commences with local consultations, validating baseline data, and formulating an implementation strategy to achieve the desired results. The various exchanges with the local administration and CSOs have improved their understanding of the objectives and priorities related to strengthening the role of CSOs and CBOs. The project objectives and perspectives were similarly shared with CSOs in all the project regions. An organizational diagnosis was conducted In Niger with 10 CSOs and CBOs to assess their strengths, weaknesses, and needs, better understand local capacities, and identify necessary capacity-building actions. This mapping process yielded valuable insights into the CSO landscape. It highlighted key intervention areas that promote peace, coexistence, and social cohesion, including civic education, public information, human rights, conflict prevention related to pastoralism, monitoring and early warning mechanisms, inter-community and cross-border social cohesion, community development, and environmental protection. Lastly, the project team developed the terms of reference for the board structure and inaugural board meeting and validated them by the PBFO and the LCBC Secretariat. Plans are underway to organize the first steering committee meeting, scheduled for the third quarter of 2024 in Ndjamena, Chad.

The process of selecting beneficiaries and implementation partners has begun with an approved call for proposals launched in Cameroon and Niger. As a result, four (4) civil society organizations have been selected in Cameroon, contracts have been signed, and funds have been disbursed to their respective bank accounts.

The project has successfully appointed all national project officers/focal points in all four countries at 50% cost share. Additionally, a dedicated acting Programme Manager, Administration, and Coordination officer has been appointed to oversee the implementation while the recruitment process at the regional level is being finalized.

Annual Work Plans have been developed and validated based on the project document in collaboration with the regional governor's offices and the PBF officers at the RCO's office. These plans have been consolidated for approval by the Steering Committee.

Planning and coordination meetings were held with all designated project teams in the four countries. Planning meetings were also held with the PBF and LCBC Secretariat to ensure a shared understanding of roles and responsibilities and enhance collaboration during implementation.

The budget for the respective countries has been reviewed and set up in the system.

In all countries, national consultations were held with the respective regions' governors' offices to formulate an implementation strategy. The project objectives and approach have been communicated to CSOs in all project regions.

Specifically, In Niger, an organizational diagnosis was conducted with 10 CSOs and CBOs to assess their strengths, weaknesses, and needs and to understand local capacities better. This mapping process provided valuable insights into the CSO landscape and highlighted key intervention areas that promote peace, coexistence, and social cohesion. The project also reviewed CSO data registered in the DIMS platform, showing that out of 89 registered NGOs/CSOs, 24 were led by women. Training on project management and the Stabilization approach was provided to 13 NGOs/CSOs and CBOs, with additional sessions on Human Rights, Gender, HACT, Monitoring, Evaluation, and Communication scheduled for the third quarter of 2024.

Women's empowerment and youth inclusion will be prioritized across the project's two outcome areas, which include selecting civil society organizations (CSOs) to benefit from the project grants scheme and identifying participants who will benefit from the project initiatives. 44% of the budget has been allocated for women's inclusion and gender empowerment. Therefore, consideration will be given in the selection process, ensuring women- and youth-led project activities are given a major focus. This is crucial for identifying with the project's target demographic: women and youth. For example, in Nigeria, out of the 299 CSOs in the DIMS, 144 are led by women (48%), and 75 are led by youth (25%). The representation of women-led CSOs in Nigeria is slightly higher than the regional average (47%), while youth-led CSOs in Nigeria are lower than the regional average (30%)."In Niger, the project reviewed CSO data registered in the DIMS platform, highlighting that out of 89 registered NGOs/CSOs, 24 were led by women. Training on project management and the Stabilization approach was provided to 13 NGOs/CSOs and CBOs, with additional sessions on Human Rights, Gender, HACT, Monitoring, Evaluation, and Communication scheduled for the second half of 2024. Participants were also sensitized on the importance of collaboration and networking, enhancing their understanding of the strategic framework for project implementation and long-term networking goals. Following the UNDP training on these themes, 30 CSOs/CBOs were newly pre-registered on the DIMS platform, representing a 34% increase. Notably, 15 new registrations were women-led (50%), and 11 were led by young people (37%), strengthening the platform's visibility and networking support.
